and lawfully jointly by these presents Sealed with our Seals and dated the
Nineteenth day of January One thousand Seven hundred and Ninety

The Condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above named
James Morin is bound in the surety Security for Thomas Whithledge Ex-
ecutor of John Whithledge deceased in the penal sum of Two thousand
pounds for his due and faithful administration of said deceased's
Estate and performance of said deceased's last Will. Now if the above
bound Thomas Whithledge his heirs Executors and Administrators shall
indemnify and keep the said Morin his heirs Executors and Administrators
Secure and Safe from all harm and Damage whatever that may accrue
or arise on account of the Security Ship for the administration aforesaid
then the above obligation to be Void, Otherwise to remain in full force
and Virtue.
