habitant of John Giddiths of Bourbon County near Paris, being sick
and low in body and in my next senses and understand-
ing do dispose of my worldly estate as follows
I give to William Giddiths my son the land on which
I live which I purchased of William Anderson being
containing one hundred and twenty acres more or
less to him his heirs and assigns forever.
I give to my son John Giddiths my daughter girl
named Nancy and her two eldest children Sen-
nis and Eliza Ann to him his heirs and assigns for-
ever except the said Nancy whom he is to retain
till the fifteenth of June eighteen hundred and twenty
two at which period I direct that she shall be free
and emancipated.

I direct and devise that so much of my personal
property exclusive of my slaves be sold as will be
sufficient to pay my debts and if there be any defi-
ciency exclusive of my slaves I direct that my executor
or Administrator have power to dispose of some part
of my lands which in their discretion will not injure
my family for that purpose.

I direct that all bills, notes, accounts and judgments
which I have against my son Peter Giddiths be paid

and released to him forever - And I direct that my
Executors raise and pay out of my Estate excepted
my share the sum of three hundred dollars at the
decease of my wife to my said son Peter - or at
the sale of my Estate hereafter directed.

I devise to my wife Dorcas Eldritch the rest of
my Estate real and personal during her natural
life - and after her death I direct that the whole
be sold - and the proceeds thereof to be divided
among my three sons Aquileas, John and Samuel
except two hundred dollars which I direct to be
paid to my son James Eldritch and the three hun-
dred dollars which I have heretofore directed to
be paid to Peter - provided however that said
sale of my Estate may be made at any time
during the life of my said wife, provided she
shall consent to and require the same to be done.

I further devise and direct that Peter the younger
child of my mulatto girl Nancy be free on the
first day of October one thousand eight hundred
and thirty eight - to which time after the decease
of my wife or the sale of my Estate as heretofore
directed he shall remain with and belong to
my son John Eldritch - provided however that said
child shall be allowed to remain with its mother
till she is free.

I further devise to my son Isaac William &
Jackson the land for which I have given him my
bond, now filed in a suit depend in the Eastern
Circuit Court wherein said Jackson is complain-
ant and I am Defendant to be laid off and bound
according to the true intent and meaning of
said bond.

I further direct and devise that one hundred
acres of land which I hold on Johnsons fork of Jack-
sons river, out of a claim entered surveyed
and patented in the name of Anthony Thornton

shall be sold by my Executors forthwith for the payment of my
debt.

I further direct and devise that the legal title of the
farm on which I live together with the sixth part of
a claim adjoining me in the name of Israel Giffin
which I purchased of John Glines and wife together
with the rest of my lands remain in my three sons
Aquileas, John and Samuel until the said shall take
place which I have heretofore directed subject however
to the life estate of my wife as heretofore directed

William Clutchell of Paris, executors of this my last
will and Testament - In testimony whereof I have here-
unto set my hand this twelfth day of March one
thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
