leave after me a full, free and irrevocable declaration
of my permanent intentions.

 President of the State Bank and to his heirs for-
 ever, all my lands, tenements and hereditaments
 either in this State or in Virginia, Pennsylvania
 and this State goods and chattels including all
 my estate real, personal and mixed of whatever kind
 it may be in the United States and wherever sit-
 uated, or found in America; to hold, enjoy or
 dispose as of his absolute and unconditional pro-
 perty. I constitute and appoint my good friend
 Lewis Remont of Millersburg Kentucky who is fully
 acquainted with all my business, The Executor of
 my last will and testament, I direct him to
 pay all my just debts; I authorize him to settle
 and adjust by compromise, arbitration
 or otherwise without suit (if possible) any con-
 troversy, relating to any part of my estate,
 which he as my executor, may have attend to.
 I also authorize him to empower any person
 he may deem proper, to transact any part
 of the duties, which may devolve on him as
 my executor. In consequence, I have set
 my hand and affixed my seal to my pre-
 sent last will all written with my own hand
 this twenty sixth day of February of the year
 one thousand eight hundred and eight
