Arizona being in a weak and low state of health,
do of our mind and judgment do be and be-
quest my estate in the manner following - my be-
loved wife Sarah have the choice of five head of horses
to be kept on the farm - Also six head of cattle -
Also all the sheep that is now on the farm I wish to
remain on the place for the use of the family and I
have given to my eldest daughter, Alice and
Nancy about the same sum of sixty five dollars I be-
queath the same amount of sixty five dollars to
each of my younger daughters, viz. Mary, Peggy,
Catherine Sarah and Delia - Also twenty of the
chooses of the hog to be kept on the farm for the
use of the family - I also bequeath to my dearest
Mile Sarah all the household and kitchen furni-
ture and various utensils belonging to the same
during her natural life - Also one Negro boy
in the name of Sam to remain on the farm until
my youngest son Spencer becomes of the age of
twenty one years also the farm on which I now

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live and the above mentioned negro boy Sam. I bequeath to my three sons viz. Bertram John and Spencer to be equally divided among them at the decease of my wife, the balance of the property on the farm now mentioned, to be sold at Publick sale some time in August next, the money arising from the sale is to pay my lawful debts and the balance to the support of the family. Also at the death of my wife Sarah I wish a sale to be made of all the property on the farm and the money to be equally divided among me my children. I do hereby name and appoint Robert Scott and Thomas Paxton to be the executors of this my last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fourteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.
