In the Name of God Amen, I John Palmer of the
County of Bourbon and state of Kentucky, being low in
body but of Perfect mind and memory do make constitute
& ordain this my Last Will and testament. Itan as
touching my worldly goods, I do hereby Dispose of them
in the following manner (to wit), first I give & bequeath
to my Beloved wife a mare, her choice of all my Cows
& And her bed & furniture and the largest Iron Kettle
and one third part of the tract of Land on which
I now live. During her life. secondly I do give to my two sons
John & George one horse and saddle apiece and I do give
to my Four sons John, George, William, & Thomas
Palmer all my Land to be equally divided between them
(reserving the dower left to my wife) or the money
reserved for the last payment, of the Land (in case
it should be lost) and all other money recovered
in consequence of the loss of the land to be divided
among them and to each of my Children now single

I give one Cow, & I do farther direct that all the remains
part of my moveable estate shall be sold at the discretion
of my Executors hereafter named & Equally
Divided among the whole of my Children. And lastly I do hereby
Constitute and Ordain my beloved wife Executrix & my son
John Palmer & my friend Charles Smith Executors to
Execute this my last will and testament in witness
I have hereunto set my Hand & seal this 3rd day of march
1796.
