In the name of God Amen I John Foster of the Town of Paris
being in a feeble State of Health but of sound and disposing
memory do make this my last will and testament hereby
revoking and annulling all former wills in manner following
Item my will and desire is, that all my just debts be paid
Item I will and direct, that one tract of land in the State
of Virginia, County of Richmond, purchased by William F.
Foster of Peter Hunt adjoining Howes Ordinary also one
tract of land in the State aforesaid in Westmoreland
County, which my Father bought of George White, adjoining
the tract of land called Peyton's Lane also one other tract
of land, in the State aforesaid, Richmond County, known
by the name of Suggs point, near Beutlers ferry, which
my Father ~~and~~ purchased of Mr. Cousin, be sold by
my Executors or administrators the money arising from
the sales to be applied to the purposes hereafter directed;
my meaning is that only my interest in those lands, being
one moiety (the other belonging to my sister,) shall be sold

Item I will and direct, that all the negroes belonging
to me, which are now in Virginia shall be sold and that
my Executors or administrators, make a division of
said negroes, with my sister the one half of them be-
longing to her.

Item I hereby confirm the deeds of gift of certain slaves
heretofore made by me to my children, and whereas I
have heretofore had and now have possession of said
slaves and have used and hired some of them as my
own, my will is, and it is expressly provided, that if
either of my children, shall ever raise a charge for
hire against my Estate for, or claim hire for the said
slaves, while in my possession, that such child shall have
no other part of my estate, and shall thereby forfeit,
all and every gift and bequest made by this my
will, and the things given by this my will to such
child shall be equally divided amongst my other
children Item I will and direct, that the tract

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of land on flat run purchased by me of Francis Mc
 Kenney shall be for the support of my wife and fam-
 ily, until my son Lucien, who was born on the 12th
 day of February 1796 shall arrive at twenty one
 years of age, and then to belong to my son Lucien
 and his heirs forever.

Item, I will and direct that my daughter Lucie-
 lia, at her marriage, shall be furnished out of my
 estate, with a good bed and furniture, or if she shall
 first arrive, at 21 years, she being born on the 2nd
 day of February 1804, that the same shall then
 be furnished her. Hence, I will and direct that the
 houses and Lots in which I now live, shall be ren-
 ted out until my son John shall arrive at twenty
 one years of age (he having been born on the 19th
 day of February 1806) and that then the said
 Houses and Lots, with the appurtenances, being
 the same, I purchased of John Barry and Joseph
 Soc, opposite the Court house, shall belong to my son
 John and his heirs forever. I direct that the rent of
 the said houses and Lot shall be equally divid-
 ed amongst my children, except that my son Mar-
 tin shall have one thousand dollars thereof more
 than the rest, applied towards the purchase of a
 tract of land for him, by the time he is twenty one
 years of age (he having been born on the 15th day
 of July 1819) and whereas I have leased and
 rented the said Houses and Lots to George Slough-
 ter jun^r for a term of five years, I hereby vest
 my Executor, or administrator, with the same
 power to enter upon the premises, or distrain in
 case the rent shall be in arrear, that I myself
 have by the said lease.

Item, I will and direct that my land on Har-
 ton, adjoining Abraham Buffers, being part of the
 land purchased of George Field, and also the one
 half of fifty acres, purchased by Edward Porter
 my dead brother of Thomas Jones, shall be sold

by my Executor or administrator, and the money arising therefrom, applied towards the payment of my debts. I will and direct, that the lot in the Town of Paris conveyed to me by Thomas Hughes adjoining the seminary, and also part of a lot adjoining the lot conveyed to Lewis H. Arnold by me, for which I hold Thomas Eadsboud, shall be sold by my Executor or administrator and the money arising therefrom applied towards the payment of my debts and I further direct that my Executor or administrator may sell the property herein expressly directed to be sold, either for ready money or upon credit as the exigencies of my estate shall require. I further will and direct the money or so much thereof as shall be necessary arising from the sales of my lands and slaves in Virginia, shall be applied towards the payment of my debts, and if any shall remain, that it shall be equally divided among my children.

Item, I will and direct that all my Slaves, which have descended to me from my father, which he inherited from my brother Edward, And also all my other Slaves not heretofore otherwise disposed of shall be kept hired out until the Christmas^{day} next, after my son Sullivan will be 21 years of age, and then they shall be equally divided among all my children. I direct that the hire of those Slaves shall be applied to the payment of my debts, if necessary, to the education of my children, and the balance if any to be equally divided among my children except that one thousand dollars thereof, shall be applied towards the purchase of a tract of Land for my son Justin, more than the rest, in addition to the one thousand dollars before given for that purpose.

I will and direct that my Mulatto boy Abram, about 20 years of age, shall be hired to some good house carpenter until the first day of

of January 1812. he shall be free and emanci-
pated, and that the sum of sixty dollars shall be
paid him out of my estate for the purpose of pur-
chasing him a set of tools.

I do also hereby direct and authorize my Exec-
utors or administrators to sell any bonds belong-
ing to my estate at such discount as they may think
proper for the purpose of raising money to satisfy
preparing demands against my estate.

I nominate and appoint, Majr William Roscoe
of Fayette County Robert Trimble, John Metcalfe,
and Gabriel Sandy, of the Town of Paris, and Wil-
liam Field, of Bourbon County, Executors of this my
last will and testament. and my will is that if
my Executors shall have any extraordinary trou-
ble in the management of my estate, that an ex-
tra allowance, such as the County Court shall
deem reasonable, shall be made them beyond the
usual allowance. I further will and direct that
in case either of the funds out of which the money
is to be raised for the purchase of a tract of land
for my son, Austin, shall fail, that the money
shall be made up out of the rest of my estate
before any division thereof.
