In the name of God Amen. I John Summers of Bourbon
under state of Kentucky being sick and weak in body, apt of perfect
mind and memory, thanks be given to God for it, calling to mind
the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all
men to die. I recommend my soul to God who gave it me, and
my body to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian manner,
at the direction of my Executors - and as touching this worldly substance
wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with, I do dispose and
bequeath of, in the following manner and form. First, I allow
my Executors to collect the debts due me, to pay off my debts,
and defray my funeral expenses. 2^d I have and bequeath unto
my beloved wife, Agnes, one black mare to be disposed at her
pleasure. Likewise my personal property to be for her use and
under her direction, during her natural life, and at her death
what remains of said property is to be equally divided among my
surviving children, allowing likewise the said Agnes my wife full
power and authority to rent or lease out the fifty acres of land
she is now in possession of during her natural life, and at her
death it is to return to my three under named daughters as to them
it is bequeathed. 3^d I have and bequeath to my two sons John and
Smith Summers each and equal part of six hundred acres of land situate
in Madison County and state aforesaid as specified in a Patent granted
freely to be enjoyed by them and their heirs and assigns forever.
4th I have and bequeath to my three daughters, viz Agnes, Hannah
and Sarah, an equal part each of the fifty acres, that we are
now in possession of, at the death of their mother, likewise one hundred
and sixty acres of land lying in Madison County adjoining land with
six hundred acres bequeathed to their brothers, likewise they are to make
as little to James Robson for the one third part of the one hundred and
sixty acres of land, he paying an equal share of the tax and taxes
due on said lands for ever, to be freely enjoyed by them their
heirs and assigns forever. Lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint
my said wife Agnes my Executor and Robert Burns my son in
law my whole Executor of this my last will and Testament
utterly revoking and annulling all former wills and Testaments
heretofore made constituted or appointed by me. In witness
