following my last will and Testament (Big) - 1st I give and
bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane Tiltott all my house
hold furniture such as beds, Pewter, Pots &c forever to
dispose of at all times in life and in death as she pleases.
2nd I further give unto my beloved wife my negro man
(Roger) my waggon and gears, two horses, one cow and
calf, four sheep, one sow and pigs, all of her own choice, and
at her death if alive to be sold and divided equally a-
mongst all my children - 3rd I give and bequeath

unto my daughter Mary Batten and the heirs of her body sixty Acres of land where she now lives to be laid of in such a manner as may appear most convenient with My Executors but if no such heir is produced at her death my will is that said land may be equally divided between my sons James Giles, and William Tiltlett. 4th I give and bequeath unto my son John Tiltlett twenty five Acres of land where he now lives to be laid of as above mentioned in the 3^d Section. but it is to be observed if said his wife should be the longest liver, she is no longer to enjoy said land than she lives, or remains a widow. My will is ^{then} it may be divided between my sons James, Giles and William Tiltlett. 5th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Jane Reed sixty Acres of land where she now lives to be laid of as mentioned in the above third Section. 6th I give and bequeath unto to my Daughter Elizabeth Boggess and the heirs of her body sixty Acres of land where she formerly lived to be laid of as observed in the third Section. 7th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Spencer sixty Acres of land to be laid of in the same tract of land that includes the above legacies. 8th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Warren and the heirs of her body sixty Acres of land where she now lives, to be laid of as before mentioned in the third Section. 9th I give and bequeath unto my son James Tiltlett twenty five Acres of land where he now lives to be laid of as before observed in the third Section. 10th I give and bequeath unto my son Giles Tiltlett seventy five Acres of land where he now lives, to be laid of as mentioned in the above Section. 11th I give and bequeath unto my son William Tiltlett seventy five Acres of land where I now live to be laid of so as to include my buildings and Orchards.
