John Forman's Will

In the name of God Amen I John
Forman of Bourbon County and state of
Kentucky being weak in body but yet of
sound and perfect understanding and
memory do hereby constitute this my last
will and testament and do desire it to be
received by all as such reaching all others
in power I most humbly bequeath my
soul to God my maker beseeching him more
mercifully to acceptance of though the all suffi-
cient merits of Jesus Christ Amen.

As to my worldly estate I will and for-
cefully order that my funeral be paid.

It is my will and desire that my be-
loved wife, Mary Forman, should keep in posses-
sion and live on my farm consisting of
one hundred acres of land to be laid off
beginning at the north corner of said survey
purchased of John Regus and to run north

include my orchard spring and welling
house which will run nearly with the
present lane from the creek, until it in-
tersects with Charles Landers' 100 acres
during her natural life in case the said
land is held, as it is now in dispute but
after her decease the said land to be sold
and an equal division to be made among
my children viz William Torman, Isaac
Torman Catherine Landers Elizabeth
Hannah, Nancy, Boyce Polly Evans and
Margaret Stride. Also there is another
one hundred acres which appears to be deficient
in the purchase of nine hundred acres made
of Rogers and if the value of said land
is obtained from said Rogers there is a true
equal division to be made among the above named
children. The balance of said tract of nine hundred
acres belongs to William and Isaac Torman
as will appear from certain bonds that are
between us. Further my beloved wife is to
have her full third of my goods and chattels
according to the amount of appraisement
or sale as she shall think best. Further it
is my will and desire that my daughters
shall have the following sums if there was such
a rising out of my movable property after sold
and collected viz to my daughter Catherine
Landers two hundred dollars Nancy Boyce

410 three hundred dollars, Polly Evans two hundred
two hundred dollars. Margaret stood two hundred
dollars. And in case there is not enough to
make up the above sums of movable prop-
erty after my wifes thirds are taken out there
must be a proportionable division according
to the above statement. And further it is
my will and deliberate desire that all my
black people be disposed in the following
manner viz First it is my will and desire
that my negre woman Hannah be free at
my death unless my wife desires her to stay
with her until her death, but then to have
her Liberty. And it is my desire that my
black woman, Nell be at liberty at my death
unless my wife should wish her to stay with
her otherwise she is at liberty. Also my black
woman Clar to be at liberty at my death
unless in the above case. Further it is my desire
that my black man James aged about eigh-
teen son of Nell be at liberty at the age of twenty
one, but is to be hired out by the year until
that age and then to be at liberty. My black
boy George son of Nell aged about fourteen
to be at liberty at the age of twenty one
but to be hired out yearly until that age
and then to be at liberty. My black boy
John son of Nell, aged eleven to be free

dollars. And in case there is not enough to
make up the above sums of moveable prop-
erty after my wifes thirds are taken out there
must be a proportionable division according

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that my black man James aged about eigh-
teen son of Nell be at liberty at the age of twenty
one, but is to be hired out by the year until
that age and then to be at liberty. My black
boy George son of Nell aged about fourteen
to be at liberty at the age of twenty one
but to be hired out yearly until that age
and then to be at liberty. My black boy
John son of Nell, aged eleven to be free

at the age of fifteen to be hired out until
that age & then to be free. My black boy
Tom son of Clear aged about fourteen to
be free at the age of twenty one and to be
hired out in manner above. My daugh-
ter of Clear aged eight years to be free at
eighteen years of age to be hired or taken
for her victuals & clothes until such time
as she can be of service & then hired.

My daughter of Clear aged about two
and a half years to be free at eighteen &
treated in the above manner with my
Tabitha daughter of Clear aged five years
to be free at eighteen. My Adam son of Clear
aged four and a half years to be free at

twenty one as above stated of the other
boys Levi aged two and a half years son
of Clear to be free at the age of twenty one
as above &c. Martin son of Clear aged
+ nine months to be free at the age of twenty
one. And further it is my will and desire
that the hire of those that are grown to years
be applied the purpose of raising and sup-
porting the small ones until they grow
to years sufficient to support themselves
& then to be hired out as the others until of
age as above stated & then for them to be at
Liberty.

And further I do hereby observe that the balance of the here of the above mentioned is to be proportioned among my children after the legacies left to my daughters are made up. And further I give and bequeath unto my son W^m Torman all my right title claims interest of a certain tract of land lying on Red River purchased from ~~John Torman~~ John Torman in partnership with said W^m Torman on the following conditions viz. The land is not yet fairly settled with regard to the right same.

But in case the said should be obtained the said William Torman is to pay unto my several heirs above mentioned the sum seventy five pounds ten shillings in property which said sum is to be equally divided among them. And further it is to be observed that there is some property belonging to my black people which I wish them to enjoy viz. Hannah a cow and calf. Nell a cow and yearling to be a two year old heifer & some sheep with their household furniture.

And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my two sons William & Aaron Torman my sole executors of this my last will and testament.
