In the name of God Amen, I John White of the County of Bourbon and State of Kentucky, being weak of body, but of perfect soundness of mind and memory, saying to mind, that it is appointed unto for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is, I recommend my soul to God who gave it, and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors.

First, all my lawful debts to be paid by my Executors, out of my whole Estate.

Item I bequeath and leave to my well beloved wife Susannah White the whole of my real and personal Estate during life, and to be disposed of by her at her death, as she may think proper, to whomsoever she may please to bestow it in her last will and testament.

Item I bequeath to my son John White the sum of five shillings to be paid by my Executors at discretion.

Item I bequeath to my son Thomas White the sum of five Shillings to be paid at the discretion of Executors.

Item I bequeath to my well beloved daughter Sally White the sum of five shillings to be paid at the discretion of my Executors.

45. Now I bequeath to my well beloved daughter Polly, White, the sum of five Shillings to be paid at the discretion of my Executors.

Lastly, I do hereby appoint my well beloved wife Susanna and Samuel Harris, to be the whole and sole executors, of this my last will and testament. I do make and appoint this my last Will and Testament, revoking all former Wills and establish this and this only to be my last will and Testament. Signed Sealed and delivered this 9th of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four On this date signed and sealed by me in presence of.
