I Joseph Park parish of Bourbon County, being of sound disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and desiring that my death is not far distant, do make and declare this my last will and Testament, my wife being now living and well and in all probability will survive me, I have at this time five sons, and four daughters living - my sons of the following names John, Thomas, Joseph, and Joseph. My Daughters are named as follows, Hannah, now single, Jane who has intermarried with Joseph Gallenberry Brling, the wife of said Gallenberry and Brling the youngest child of my family, my two daughters who have intermarried with the Gallenberry family are at present to their full portions of my Estate, except that Brling is still entitled to a good slice of land which I intend to be assigned to her after my death, if she shall not hereafter receive it during my life, I have likewise given already to my two sons John and Thomas a good horse each, and Joseph each of them to be worth eighty Dollars as an advancement. I am not now indebted to any considerable amount, but there will be some expenses attending upon the Administration of my Estate. My personal expenses and modest debts, which may yet be necessary for myself and family, before my decease, may be increased. I therefore direct that after an Inventory and Appraisement of my personal Estate, shall be made at the best manner, so much of my personal Estate shall be sold as my wife shall require and the cash conveniently spent, at a proper credit, and out of the proceeds thereof the aforesaid debts and expenses shall be discharge if any exist. The residue of my personal Estate after debts and expenses paid, I leave the use thereof to my wife during her natural life, and do not wish her to be disturbed in

in the enjoyment of it without her consent. And at the death of my wife I direct what remains of it to be divided or distributed in the following manner, to wit, I shall be sold at a proper credit to bring its value and the amount of the sale shall be divided into three equal parts one of which shall belong to my daughter Hannah, another to my daughter Brling, and the remaining third shall be divided between my three sons, viz: John, Joseph and Joseph until they each receive to the amount of eighty Dollars each, and if there is still more, then the residue is to be divided equally between my four sons, but in order to show more charity by intention it is to be divided that all my personal Estate after debts and expenses are paid as aforesaid is at the discretion of my Executors charge with the maintenance and education of my children during the life of my wife. - I have no other articles I have been heretofore named in the family as belonging to my daughter Hannah, and has heretofore been claimed as hers it not to be sold for the payment of debts nor is it to be retained by my Executors for the maintenance of my family or support of my wife, but my daughter Hannah is to take it at my death as her own, nor is she to be accountable for it at the final division before directed.

The form upon which I now live in Bourbon County with the tract of land on which this situation supports to contain one hundred acres conveys to me by John H. Combs - I wish to my wife until my youngest son Joseph comes of age if she shall so long live, and out of the proceeds of her sale to maintain herself and such of her children as remain with her, at her discretion, and after my youngest son Joseph shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, I direct that my Executors or Administrators with the full consent shall use the same at public Auction, for the best price that can be had, and that said sale to be made at such credit or payment in such instalments as will insure the full value thereof, but also secure the purchase money, and the money coming from the sale to be divided as heretofore directed, and such conveyances shall be made as may be sufficient to pass the title, and give my Estate to my wife the same of necessity.

I desire a tract of land containing nominally three hundred acres in the County of Butler conveys to me by John H. to my two sons, John and Thomas to be equally divided between them according to quantity and quality and the same to take place on my death in full payment.

I desire my youngest son, come of age and the sale of the form on which I live in Bourbon is executed as before directed. I desire that three Commissioners of good character shall be appointed by the County Court of Bourbon and said Commissioners or a majority of them shall proceed to report to Court to be then called on upon the value of said tract of land in Butler, at that time, considered as most land without regard to any improvements, which may have been made thereon, in whose hands said said land may then be. If my son two sons John and Thomas have sold it, this value so ascertained shall be added to the price for which my land in Bourbon may sell, and the whole be divided into five

five equal parts - if the value of said lands in Butler shall equal or exceed three thirds of the aforesaid rate and is to be made in Boston of my said three, then my said sons John and the said shall not receive any part of the rate in Boston nor shall they be compelled to fall short of the thirds of the rate made in Boston, my said sons John and the said shall receive so much of the purchase money of the Boston lands as will make them equal to the thirds of the purchase money of the whole value of the said two tracts, and the amount of the purchase money in Boston shall be divided between my said sons, the said Joseph and the said, and if the value of the Butler lands shall exceed or equal the thirds of the said purchase money, then the whole price of the said lands shall be equal to the thirds of the said purchase money, and the said Joseph and the said shall receive the same as the said sons John and the said.

I hereby appoint my wife Sarah and my son Joseph and the said Patrick Executors of this my last will and testament and charge them with the due execution thereof. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th day of May 1787.
