I Margret Native of Bourbon County and State of Kentucky Single Woman of the age of fifty one and in a weak condition my health much impaired, but sound in Judgment calling to mind my mortal State by name and that I appointed unto all once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament first recommending my Soul to God who gave it and my body to

doceatly moved, nothing doubting but I shall receive it again at
 at the last day, and as wishing such thing as God in his provi-
 dence has been pleased to bless me with in this life after the pay-
 ment of my funeral expences, I give, devise, & dispose of in the fol-
 lowing manner that is to say, it is my will and I do order that
 in the first place that all that emolument left me by my Father's
 last Testament and now in the hands of my well beloved Brother -
 Stephen Wallace which is and was to be Six pounds per year, be en-
 tirely for the use and behalf of him the s^r. Stephen, I am I
 further Ordain that that part of the estate that fell to me by
 the decease of my well beloved Brother Andrew be given to Brother
 Joseph to be for his use; my riding wear I bequeath to my well
 beloved ^{mother} Jean Wallace and the belt to Stephen, again I ordain
 and bequest to my niece Margret Sonson my Bed and
 furniture, I further Ordain and bequeath to my beloved
 niece Mary Hamilton my Drawers and ^{petticoat}, my wearing
 apparel, I leave in the hand of my loving Mother to be
 at her disposal and I do ratify and confirm the above
