almighty God who gave it to me and my body at my decease I recomend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the direction of my Executors whom I shal hereafter appoint and as touching such worldly substance and property as it have pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and I bequeath the same in manner and form as followeth Viz I bequeath to my grand aughter martha black the daughter of my son Robert the sum of ten pounds current money and one striped calico gown of of my wearing apparel and I bequeath to my grandaughter Martha Patrick Black the daughter of my son Samuel ten pounds current money and one flowered callico gown of my wearing apparel the residue of my wearing apparel I allow to be equally divided between the families of my sons Robert Black and Samuel Black, and lastly I bequeath to my son William Black all the residue of my estate and property of whatsoever kind it may be either money, goods beds household

or stock of whatsoever kind it may be
to him forever and lastly I hereby nomi-
nate constitute appoint my two well be-
loved sons Robert Black and William Black
to be the executors of this my last will
and Testament and I hereby revoke and
disannull all former or other wills by me
made ratifying and confirming this only
to be my last will and Testament. I

sixth day of August anno domini one
thousand seven hundred and ninety
seven.
