

83. In the name of God Amen I Mary Allen of Bourbon County and State
m. Allen of Kentucky being in perfect health and sound mind yet aware of the
uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being desirous to dispose
of the Estate it hath pleased the Almighty to bless me with do hereby
make And Ordain this my last will and Testament hereby
revokeing all other wills which I may have heretofore made and do
do dispose of my Estate in the following manner to wit
I devise to my son William Mountjoy Allen the following negroes
to wit Rose, Giles and Judith and the Increase of the said Rose
and Judith to him and his heirs forever but my will and desire is
that if my son William should die without heirs lawfully begotten that
in that case the said negroes Rose Giles and Judith and the Increase
of the said Rose and Judith should descend to my son John Mountjoy
Allen and his heirs forever.

I devise to my son John Mountjoy Allen the following negroes to wit
Wile Tom Bob and Sarah and the Increase of the said Sarah to him
and his heirs forever.

I devise to my daughter Mary Mountjoy Smith the following negroes
to wit Cloc John and Solomon and the Increase of the said
Cloc to her and her heirs forever but my will and desire is
that if my daughter Mary Mountjoy Smith should die without child
dren that in that case the said negroes John Solomon and Cloc
and the Increase of the said Cloc should descend and go to my
son William and John and Elizabeth Shipp and their heirs in equal
proportion.

And whereas Saban Shipp my son in law is indebted to my son
John in the sum of Seventy two pounds my will and desire is that
the said Saban Shipp shall be released and forever acquitted
from the payment of the said seventy two pounds in consideration of
his giving up to my son John the negro man named Tom it being
the same negroe willed to my son John.

I devise to my daughter Elizabeth Shipp one bed and furniture.

I devise to my son William and John all my Stock of every description
and all my household and Kitchen furniture together with all my plan
tation Utensils of every kind to be equally divided between them.

My will and desire is that Edmund Mountjoy and James Garrard
shall be executor to this my last will.

In Testimony whereof I do declare and pronounce this to be my
last will and Testament given under my hand and Seal this seven
teenth day of August one thousand Eight hundred three.
