 receive the same again and as for my body

 in a decent Christian manner at the discre-
 tion of my Executors and as for my worldly
 estate I give and dispose of the same in man-
 ner and form as followeth. Item I give and
 bequeath to my son William Hall the planta-
 tion whereon I now live containing one hundred
 acres to him and his heirs forever the William
Hall is to maintain my loving wife Hannah
Hall as long as she lives in a decent manner
 out of the profits arising out of the value of
 my land as long as she lives. Item I give
 and bequeath to my daughter Mary the

 son Moses Hall one Dollar to him and his heirs
 forever my said son ^{Hall} Moses is to be accounta-
 ble to my executors for the money he is now

 my grandson Moses Hall the son of my son Moses
 Hall ten pounds to him and heirs forever Item I
 give and bequeath to my son Alexander Hall
 one Dollar to him and his heirs forever my said
 son Alexander Hall to be accountable my ex-
 cutors for the money that is due Item I give and
 bequeath to my grandson Moses Hall the son of
 my son Alexander Hall ten pounds current money
 to him and his heirs forever Item I give and be-
 queath to my son John Hall one Dollar to him
 and his heirs forever Item I give and bequeath
 to my grandson Moses Hall the son of my son
 John Hall ten pound current money to him
 and his heirs forever Item I give and bequeath
 to my son Aaron Hall twenty pounds current
 money to him and his heirs forever Item I give
 and bequeath to my grand children Fanny
 the children of my Daughter Mary Foster

one dollar to be equally divided among
 them to them and their heirs forever then
 it is my will and desire that my loving
 wife Hannah Hall shall have the use of
 all the rest of my estate of all kinds what-
 ever except what is all ready mentioned
 for and dure her natural life and at
 her death to be equally divided amongst
 all the legates. And lastly I appoint my
 friend William Milligan and Aaron Hall
 my whole and sole executors of it is my last
 Will and Testament as witness my hand and
 seal the day and year above written

 This last Will and Testament of Chas. Hall
 deceased was produced in open Court and found
 according to Law by the oaths of Jesse Fitzgerald
 Arthur Scott and Leonard cross witnesses true
 and ordered to be recorded. And on the
