bay horse both to be delivered to the care of some person  
whom the Court of Bourbon County shall see fit to appoint  
to apply the same to their use. I also give to my grand-  
daughter Mary Bevan, daughter of Charles Bevan my de-  
ceased son, my side saddle, my bed and furniture and  
all my cash, and cash notes and accounts, Judgments exe-  
cutions &c to me in any way belonging. I give & bequeath to  
my son Ephraim Bevan to be put in the hands of a committee  
whom the Court of Bourbon County shall appoint over him,  
and at the death of my said son and any part re-  
maining my will and desire is, that the same be equal-  
ly divided amongst the children of my son Cornelius  
Bevan, and my mare, and her young colt, my will  
and desire is that she be sold at public sale and the  
money arising from said sale to be applied to the use  
of my son Ephraim Bevan, and at his death, if any  
part be left to go to the use of the children of my  
son Cornelius Bevan, as above; and after the above  
legacies are all paid, my will and desire is, that my re-  
maining property be put into the hands of my daugh-  
ter-in-law Rebecca Bevan, for the use of my grandchildren  
in such manner that the same shall not be subject to  
the disposal of my son Cornelius Bevan.
