First as I have my living with my daughter Polley McMillin I will that she be paid for all the trouble that she may have with me during my stay with her, I promise I bequeath that after all expense and trouble be discharged the balance (if any) be equally divided amongst my four children, (viz) James Edmond Robert Edmond Polley McMillin and Betsy Gibson I further bequeath that all my clothing be given to my daughter Polley and to be fully at her disposal, I further ordain constitute and appoint James Houston my Executor of this my last will and testament reciting whereof I do hereby set my hand and affix my seal this thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & forty four

143 Resolved to an order of the Bourbon County Court at their September term 1810 to us the undersigned, directed to examine state and settle with William Clarkson and William Alhier executors of Harmonious Alhier deceased after being duly sworn report the above £ 1759 19..10 being all the money due the Estate which was paid out to the legates of said Alhier deceased as stated above except £ 30 retained in the hands of William Clarkson as shown in the 18th line marked ++ as a partial allowance for his trouble and expenses of his executorship the undersigned commissioners is of the opinion that the said William Clarkson is entitled to 9 more which makes £ 39 for his trouble and expenses £ 99 of the same being yet due from the said deceased's estate and are further of opinion that there is due William Alhier £ 447 2 2 for his trouble and expenses of his executorship, it being a compensation for his going to the State of Virginia and back and for attending a lawsuit in Harrison County in behalf of said Estate also £ 147 2 2 included in the same it being money paid for the benefit of said estate since the above division was made, given under our hands this 21st day of September 1814
