upon the atoning righteousness of Jesus
Christ for the pardon of all my sins and
acceptance with God. And for the settling
of my temporal property I do nominate
and appoint my wife Jenny and Charles
Kemp my sons my executors and order that
all legal debts that I owe and funeral char-
ges be paid out of my personal estate.

I will to my well beloved wife Jenny my
land I now live on induring her life and all my
other personal estate as long as she lives and at
her ~~decease~~ ^{decease} I will my plantation that I now
live on to my son Charles Kemp by his paying
the ballance that is yet unpaid of the purchase
of said land and I will to my four sons Ed-
ward Reuben James and Charles all my
personal estate at the death of my wife if
not ~~before~~ ^{before} use of in her lifetime for her sup-
port

support to be equally divided amongst
the four. As witness whereof I have set my
hand and seal this 29th of March 1807

This last Will and Testament of Reuben
Kemp deceased was produced in open court
and proved according to Law by the oaths
of James Parks and James Cleveland two of
the witnesses thereto and ordered to be re-
corded. And on the motion of Charles
Kemp and Jenny Kemp the Executors named
in the said Will who made oath thereto and
together with Robert Scrogin their security
entered into and acknowledged their bond
in the penalty of \$500 conditioned as the
Law directs. Certificate is granted them
for obtaining a probate thereof in due
form.
