 Then - It is my will that three of my negroes Dany Perry and Jack be sold for the purpose of paying my just debts and the surplus of my stock I give and bequeath to the balance of my personal estate to my beloved wife Peggy to her and her heirs forever - Saving that she is to pay to my Daughter Sally Beldens one hundred and fifty dollars in addition to the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars which I think I have formerly given her.

Lastly I appoint my wife Peggy my James Rogers and John Barnett Executors and Receivers of this my last will and Testament - Given under my hand and seal the twelfth day of March eighteen hundred and fourteenth
