In the name of God Amen I Richard Stewart of Bourbon County and State of Kentucky Being now advanced in years, And frail in Body, yet of a perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my body, And knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say first of all, I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body I commend to the earth, from whence it came, to be buried in a christian like manner in hopes of a glorious resurrection And as touching such worldly Estate which it has pleased god to bless me with in this life, I do give and bequeath as followith. Item First to my loving wife Sally Stewart, I do give and ~~allot~~ allot her the whole of the land or premises whereon we now live during her natural life or widowhood And my corner cupboard which stands in the dwelling house And all the cupboards ware which belongs to said Cupboard, Also all the Farming utensils so far as respects the plows, hoes, axes, &c. And every thing else to be sold but what is herebefore mentioned, And after all my legal debts are paid out of my estate then for my wife Sally Stewart to have half of the residue have it at its appraisement, during her natural life or widowhood, as above mentioned. Item the other half yet remaining of my Estate the money arising from the sales thereof shall be paid over by my Executors as shall be hereafter mentioned Item, that one hundred Dollars to my youngest son

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son William Stewart, to my youngest Daughter Nancy Stewart, fifty dollars, to Nancy Alexander that lives with me, ten pounds, the balance, then the balance of any remaining to be equally divided among all my children, and at the death of my wife Sally Stewart then the land and all to be sold and equally divided among my children now I do here make and appoint my son John Stewart and Eliza Stewart Sole Executors of this my last will and testament and I do utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament, will be a cy: to ratify and confirm this and no other to be my last will & testament.
