In the name of God Amen I Samuel Douglass last will and Testament being at this time sick & weak in bed do ratify myself to be sound in mind and of a disposing memory and constitute this my last will and Testament First it is my will that out of my Estate all my lawful Debts shall be paid. Secondly it is my will that my beloved Wife Hannah Douglass shall have one third part of all my Estate both real and personal during her natural life and as a part of which I give and bequeath to her the more and all I now have & receive & shall also have the use of all my household furniture and property that is used in a household & excluded by me to Joshua Hall during her life and her bequeath unto her such other and further supplies as may be necessary for her support during her life as also the household furniture, the other live stock not given nor hereafter ought to her use, I desire may be sold to pay my Debts. I give and bequeath all my wearing cloaths to my brother William Douglass, and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to John Mc Nutt my sister's son twenty five pounds to him and his heirs forever. I give & bequeath to Samuel Douglass my brother's son twenty five pounds to him and his heirs forever. All the balance of my Estate whatsoever the one half to be Equally divided among the children of my brother William Douglass and the other half to be Equally divided among the children of Hannah Douglass who is my sister's daughter. I give and bequeath to Elisabeth Wilson five pounds to be given her before the above division takes place and I appoint my brother William Douglass James Stark, and John Houghton Executors to this my will. Witness my hand this 23rd day of July 1799.

And on the motion of William Longlapp and James Starke two of the Executors thereon named, who made oath thereto, one together with James Brown and William Butler their securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of eight hundred pounds conditions agreeably to law certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form. Abel Huddington the other Executor named in said will declines taking upon himself the burden of the execution thereof.
