This last Will & Testament of Isaac Wadsworth

In the name of God, Almighty. Amen.

I Samuel Jarrison of Rowan County & State of Kentucky
being weak in body but of perfect wit and of mind & re-
ason, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that
it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and declare this
my last Will & Testament. That is to say, first of all I commend
my soul to God, who gave it, and my body I commend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner
at the discretion of my Executors and directing that the

130 receive the same as agreed at the General Assembly.

And with regard to my worldly Estate, I bequeath the
dispose of them in the manner following viz

Item. I give, assign, sell, convey and sell unto my
family, and bequeath unto my well beloved eldest brother
and Jameson's eldest son Charles, the just & full Sum of
Shillings.

Item. I give and bequeath unto Samuel Robinson, now
living with me, one bay year old mare Colt, come of the
mare that I sold to Benjamin Wadsworth.

Item. I give and bequeath to my well beloved and only
wife Rebecca, the remaining part of my whole Estate, real
& personal, including all debts, Bonds and Obligations, the re-
mains therein specified to be recovered by her, her heirs &
Assigns or Assigns, according to law and justice, as if by myself
in person present, of which Estate she is to be the only and sole
possessor during life and to enjoy it in that way that will be most
conducive to her happiness, and that it may be so disposed. I
do in this my last Will & Testament order that she choose one
horse, two Cows, and what number of Sheep she pleases, out of
my Stock, and that the rest be sold by Vendue, and the price
of them to be put to Interest, or to be disposed of as she may
think will be most conducive of her happiness in life. And
at her death, all that I now possess, except the lands on which I
now live, to be disposed of by her to whom she may think proper
to give it. After the death of my well beloved & only wife Re-
becca, I give and bequeath the same to my eldest son Charles.

In the name of God. Amen. I Andrew Clark of the County of Bourbon, and State of Kentucky, being very weak and weak in body, but of perfect Mind, and Memory, thank be given unto God, calling unto Mind the Mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, to make & ordain this my last Will and Testament: that is to say, I hereby & first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of our Father. Next I give and my body I leave

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to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors. Nothing wanting but at the general resurrection. I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate, wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise & bequeath of the same in the following manner and form.

I give and bequeath to Rebecca, my dearly beloved wife, my Plantation, wherupon I now live with all the profits and advantages accruing therefrom by Cultivation to her and her Children during her life. — And at my wife's death, I give and bequeath to my two little daughters, Eliza Wright & Eliza, and Polly, the said Plantation to be equally divided between them, and to be freely possessed and enjoyed by them and their heirs for ever.

Also I give and bequeath to my two little Sons, James Allen, & Andrew my Plantation, contained in two Tracts & lying on Howard's Creek, in Clark County Ohio Territory, to be equally divided between them both in quantity and quality, & to be freely possessed by them and their heirs for ever. Together with all the advantages accruing therefrom from now and henceforward.

Also my two Negroes, Sam, & Doll, I grant and allow to be set at liberty, if from the Judgment of their owners, & the Executors, they shall have served truly and faithfully, I mean until the age of thirty five years, & Doll thirty three.

Also my Black, and Black Bonds, I give and bequeath to my two sons James Allen, and Andrew, to be shared out to them & kept for the use of their Education. Also my Negroes, Doll
