 it is appointed for all men once to die,
 to make and obtain this my last will
 and testament. That is to say, I give and recommend
 my soul into the hands of God that gave
 it, and for my body I recommend it to the
 earth to be buried in a Christian like and
 decent manner at the discretion of my exe-
 cutors, nothing doubting but at the general
 Resurrection I shall receive them and again
 by the merit of Jesus Christ and in trusting such
 mercifully shall be reunited to my body for to
 bless me in this life I recommend and dispose
 of the same in manner and form following,
 that is to say.

In the first place I give to my son William
 the sum of two dollars and to my son John
 the sum of two dollars. I also give the sum of two
 dollars to my daughter Elizabeth. I also give to my daughter
 Mary the sum of two dollars. and I give
 my dear and wife that she the payment of
 the first and several debts and the expenses
 of my funeral that the residue of my estate
 be divided in manner following between my
 son William and my daughter Mary
 Jane and Mary Jane, excepting one bay mare
 and colt which go from Nicholas Hulse and
 one hundred acres of land which is in his
 for which I have obtained judgment in the
 Circuit Court of Brunswick County it being
 a part of a claim of five hundred acres
 of land patented to William H. Blanton
 and decided by his son Thomas H. Blanton
 to me as by the record in the office of the
 Clerk of Brunswick County will more fully appear.
