I Thomas Jones of the Town of Paris and County of Bourbon do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following: I give and devise unto my beloved wife, Effia Jones during her natural life only, the dwelling house in which I now live and the two lots enclosed thereunto and attached thereto, adjoining Dr. Andrew Todd: Also one tract of land containing twenty five acres, lying between the George Town road and Boston conveyed to me by Isaac Gilpin by deed bearing date the tenth day of December 1779. Also one other tract of land containing twenty four acres lying on the south side of the George Town road (including my meadow ground) conveyed to me by said Gilpin by deed bearing date the thirtieth day of August 1779. - Also all that part of a tract of land containing sixteen acres conveyed to me by said Gilpin on the ninth day of June 1808. that lies on the north west side of the road that leads from the south end of high street and intersects the Lexington road, leading out of main street beyond where David Dr. Jones lives; except what shall be given afterwards otherwise disposed of - Also all my out lots in and adjoining the Town of Paris, ~~except the out lots in and adjoining the Town of Paris~~, except the out lots on which my Mill stands on stone - Also my negro man Jim and my two negro boys, Willis and Mars - Also my six and gray horses and the sorrel mare that usually works in the waggow together with my waggow and all the harness belonging thereto - Also

six of my cattle such as ^{the} ~~the~~ may choose, all my
 sheep and geese and all my household and
 kitchen furniture, except four beds and their
 furniture, which are claimed by, and are here
 by given to my ^{two} Daughters Sally and Jane. Also
 I give to my wife the right of cutting and car-
 rying off the wood and wood for rail, and
 other repairs from the land I purchased of
 Robert Pearce and wife and of John Gillo-
 way out of the west end of William Galloway
 ways (dec^d preemption: - Also I give my
 wife two hundred bushels of corn annually
 during her life to be raised from my farm,
 on which Moses Ketchum and Purcell
 now live. I also give her sixty bushels of
 wheat annually during her life to be raised
 out of my estate.

Item I give and bequeath to my sons James
 M. Jones and Thomas Jones, Thomas Mitchell
 of the Town of Paris, Andrew & Wright of Bour-
 bon County and Nicholas Calhoun Esq^r of
 said County and the survivor of them, or
 such of them as may take upon them the
 trust, seven and a half acres of land
 including the house in which David Brown
 now lives and bounded as follows to wit. Be-
 ginning at a boxelder corner to an old lot
 and also corner to two tracts of land bought
 of Israel Gilpin, standing in Reed's preemp-
 tion line, running thence south sixty two
 degrees west forty eight and three fourth poles
 to a stake, thence south sixty and a half
 degrees east passing a small forked walnut
 in a sink hole forty poles to the road leading
 out of the south end of high street, thence
 with said road and street north twenty

384. three fourth parts to the beginning in trust & for the special ^{purpose} and confidence that they, their survivors, or such of them as may take upon them the trust shall hold the same for the sole and separate use of my daughter Betsey Brown during her natural life, and no longer, freed from the power and controul of her husband or any other, and that they said Trustees shall apply and permit to be applied the profits thereof to her sole and separate use for her natural life as aforesaid; and also to permit her to reside thereon and occupy the same; and after the death of my said daughter Betsey Brown I give and bequeath the said seven and one half acres of land aforesaid to such child or children of my said daughter Betsey Brown as may be living at the death of my said daughter Betsey, if any, and if none such be then living, then to go to my other children and their heirs equally except my daughter Alisandra Brown or her children.

Item, I give and bequeath to my sons James H Jones and Thomas Jones, Thomas, (Litchell) of the Town of Paris, Alexander A Wright of Bedford County, and Nicholas Talbot Esquire of said County, and the survivor of them, or such of them as may take upon themselves the trust hereafter expressed, all that part of my tract of land commonly called the meeting house tract, which lies on the north west side of the road leading from Paris to Lincolnton, containing by estimation about one hundred and twenty five acres, and including the tenements where Daniel Litchcock and Abraham Peebles now live, in trust and for the special purpose and

confidenced that they, the survivor of them or each
 of them as may take upon them this Trust, shall
 hold the same for the sole and separate use
 of my Daughter, Susanna Brown during her
 natural life and no longer free from the
 power and controul of her husband or any
 other; and that they said Trustees shall ap-
 ply and permit to be applied the profits there-
 of to and for her separate use for her natural
 life as aforesaid; and shall also permit her
 to reside thereon and occupy the same dur-
 ing her life as aforesaid; and after the
 death of my said Daughter, Susanna Brown
 I give and bequeath the said one hundred
 and twenty five acres of land be the same more
 or less according to the description thereof aforesaid
 to such child or children and the issue

 forever, equally to be divided among them and
 their heirs; and I direct that my slaves shall
 not be sold by my Executors hereafter named

 portion of my estate herein vested in Trustees

for the use of my two Daughters, Alisanna and Betsy shall not be subject to the payment of my debts, unless and until my debts shall or may reduce the value of the portions herein given to my other children, so as to be not more than equal in value to their portions, and their children, but when that shall happen I shall all I then direct that the portions of all of my children shall contribute equally towards the payment of the residue of my debts. I nominate and appoint my sons Thomas Jones, James W Jones, Thomas Mitchell of the Town of Paris, Andrew H Wright and Nicholas Talbot Esquires (before named) Executors and Trustees of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all former wills by me made.
