And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament, wills, bequests, legacies and executors by me in any before named, wished and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this twenty ninth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten. Also it is my wish and desire that John Aker my brother in law and Nancy my wife shall be appointed Executors to my will.
