 she the said Mary and I was married and brought with her
 to me (that is to say)
 And also after all my just Debt is paid and discharged the
 one third of my personal property or worldly goods that I
 own I give I bequeath to my said wife Mary and the in-
 crease of my worldly goods or property and whatever I own
 and bequeath with I give and bequeath to my dear children
 one of which my said wife Mary is pregnant with To be
 divided equally share and share alike when they come
 of full age, or to the age of twenty one years, each is
 to receive his quota or share, whose names are Thomas
 the Andrus Alex George and Frederick all I leave
 at the Discretion of my Trusty Friends James Linn,
 John I nominate appoint make and receive my sole
 executor of this my last will and Testament in trust
 for the intent and purpose herein contained and for

 no other to be my last will and Testament my
 body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
 decent and Christian like manner, my soul I re-
 commend to God through the merits and mediation of
 my Lord and saviour Jesus Christ in hope of a joyful
 resurrection and as concerning such worldly property
 whereunto it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
 I give bequeath and dispose of the same in manner
 and form following — I desire that all my legal
 Debt may be paid by my Executors hereinafter named

John Glasgow of the County of Bourbon and State of Kentucky Being weak of Body, but of sound mind & Memory thanks be given unto God and calling to mind the mortality of my Body. Do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say Principally I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to be decently Interred at the Discretion of my Executors and I give and bequeath my worldly Estate I give demise and Dispose of in the following Manner & form
First I give and bequeath to Anne my wellbeloved Wife the whole household furniture Bed & Bedding cloths and all my Books except as herein after excepted with all her own wearing cloths of all kinds her saddle and spurring Wheel my Fur Hat and the tanned Leather all the grain of the ground and on the ground and my time of the Land on which I live with her choice of two Cows out the flock what hay she may kill for work next winter with all the flax hemp and wool and all Kitchen utensils.
Also I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Polly all her Mothers Colter stick & Buckles and a gold ring that was her mothers; her mothers Bed and bed Cloths and Bible. also to my well beloved Daughter Nancy I do bequeath three pounds to be put to interest
