Shrother. In the name of God amen! I Thomas Shrother wife of Bourbon County and state of Kentucky being very weak and low in body but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. Item, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Kelly Shrother my negro fellows Cyrus and Sam and my negro woman Easter together with her four children to wit, Charlotte Edmond, Jim and Raphael together with my three old negroes

negroes to wit, Robin Sarah and Livery, to be at her disposal as she may think proper at her death by will or otherwise. Together with the one third part of all my stock of Horses cattle sheep and hogs and the like proportion of all my Household and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils during her natural life. Item, I give unto Thomas Benson son of William one Hundred and fifty acres of Land laying and being on the Dividing ridge and in the County of Fayette it being the place that Zedariah Benson now lives on together with one three year old horse Colt got by the stud kept by William Markham. Item, I give unto William and Thomas McLanahan Sons of Thomas McLanahan Jr. seven negroes, to wit, Sampson David, Barbary, Phibey and her child Cyrus, Sally and Andrew to them and their heirs. Item, I give unto Peggy Polley, Anne and Meriah daughters to the aforesaid Thomas McLanahan two hundred pounds each to be paid when they marry or come of age by my heirs after named Executors, the use due of my Estate after paying off the aforesaid legacies. I give to Thomas McLanahan Jr. whom I appoint together with my wife Kelly my lawful Executors. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 3^d day of April 1798.
