Dummermon sons of my Daughter dear Ammermon - also the before mentioned personal property I will and allow to remain to my two Grand Daughters being Ammermon and dear Ammermon Daughters of dear Ammermon to be theirs, their heirs and assigns forever - also I bequeath to my Daughter late being Dillen the other half of my Land including one half of the clear Land and Orchard, the team and equipage belonging thereunto, with the half of my moveable property to be hers, her heirs and assigns forever.

And I nominate constitute and appoint my friends, John Moore and John Patton my sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament - and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament or will by me made also all Executors by me appointed calling and confirming this and they only to be my Last Will and Testament - In Witness whereof I have hereunto my hand and seal this

second day of April in the year of our Lord 1840 one thousand eight hundred and four teen - signed, sealed, published pronounced and delivered by the said Samuel Dillen as his Last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presents and in the presents of each other have hereunto subscribed our names -
