It is likewise my will that all the grain of every kind and the whole stock of hogs is to stand on the plantation for the use of the family, and one half of the span of oxen that is now in the house is to be equally divided between my three daughters Elizabeth, Nancy and Rebecca.

It is my will that all my personal property be sold and equally divided among my children except Aquilias land Greenbury who has got by bequeathing all that I designed giving them only Aquilias is to have forty dollars arising out of the proceeds of the sale of said property. It is also my will that black Lucy and her children be set at liberty to work to earn their freedom from this time henceforth and that my executors here after mentioned shall cause a record to be entered in town to that amount.

Lastly I appoint my beloved son Aquilias Tucker and my wife Anne Tucker executors to this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth month day of December one thousand eight hundred and eleven.
