

In the name of God. I William C. Worklin of Benton County and Commonwealth of Kentucky; being at present weak of body, yet by divine goodness in perfect Mind and memory, for which I ascribe Almighty God, & therefore do make and appoint this to be my last Will & Testament, in the manner and form following. First I desire fully to surrender my Soul into the hands of God, who gave it into the arms of Jesus Christ, by whose merit & Righteousness I expect Salvation, and hope to stand justified before God, at the last day, and as for my body I leave it to be decently buried by my surviving friends, at the discretion of my Executors, whom I shall hereafter appoint, and as for my temporal Estate, or worldly Goods, which God has blessed me with I do give and distribute in the manner following. I give and devise to my beloved wife Mary Worklin, all my personal Estate together with the Plantation I now live on as long as she continues in her widowhood, it is my desire that the above mentioned part of my Estate shall be equally divided amongst my Children including the parts they have already received, at the decease or marriage of my wife. I give and devise to my son Bowles Worklin, two hundred Acres of Land it being part of the Tract of Land I now live on to him and his heirs for ever, he shall have free liberty to settle on any part of said Land without

standing the above is not to interfere with my present Settlement and at the decease or marriage of my wife, he shall have possession of the whole exclusive such parts as I shall hereafter mention.

I give and devise to my son Bowles Worklin, one hundred Acres of Land including his present Settlement, to be taken off the South, and East end of my tract of Land, leaving a strip way between my Pasture and field fences.

I give and devise to Bowles Worklin, Eliza Worklin, William Canady Worklin, five hundred Acres of Land, lying on the Ohio, it being the balance of the tract that I let Mr. Bowles have to be equally divided amongst them according to quantity, and quality to them and their heirs for ever. Now in case Mr. Bowles, does not relinquish the right of the Land I now live on agreeable to contract then my son Bowles Worklin, shall have two hundred Acres of Land upon the Ohio, & Tennesse River, one hundred, it being the Land said Bowles, was to have in place of this.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Mary Worklin, Executrix, and my son Bowles Worklin, Co-Executor of this my last Will and Testament this twenty ninth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred & ninety two
