 one hundred and fifty acres of land on the east end of my Tract
 where Thomas Mathews now lives

Fifthly John & James Gallaway my sons shall have all the share
 of land that James Gallaway and Willbrough Hamilton is now
 living on and is to be equal shares for all that is mentioned
 out of the same Tract according to Junctivity and Quality

Sixthly I leave and bequesth to my youngest son James Gallaway

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the Manner that I have been so long praying one hundred Pounds
 out of the same to the other heirs of the Family Pounds as soon as he comes
 of age to be paid at the rate of Twenty five Pounds yearly the eldest to receive
 the first Payment and so on according to Junctivity Likewise I also allow my
 Son William to pay out of what I have Bequesth to him Twenty
 Pounds as soon as he comes of age to be paid to the rest of the heirs as they
 be Debited hereafter. viz, but if George and John & James Gallaway or
 either of them should happen to lose their land that I have Bequesth to
 them by their claims or any other way so that they should not obtain it they
 are then to come in equal shares of the one hundred and Twenty five Pounds

and their full share of all the movable property according to the Bequesth

But if John & James Gallaway obtain only three hundred Pounds
 of the Land Bequesth to them then they are to have no share in the
 one hundred and Twenty five Pounds but the said sum to be equally

Divided Between the three Sisters Mary Anne & Rebecca Gallaway
 and likewise their share of the movable property according to possession
