 July one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, make
 and publish this my last will and Testament, in manner
 following (That is to say) first I give to my dear living
 wife, Mary, All the property or goods that she owns, when
 she the said Mary and I was married and brought with her
 to me (That is to say)
 And also after all my just Debt is paid and discharged the
 one third of my personal property or worldly goods that I
 now possess I bequeath to my said wife Mary and the in-
 crease of my worldly goods or property and whatever I am
 now indebted with I give and bequeath to my dear children
 one of which my said wife Mary is pregnant with To be
 divided equally share and share alike when they come
 to full age, or to the age of twenty one years, each is
 to receive his quota or part, whose names are Thomas
 the Andrus Alex George and Frederick all I leave
 at the Discretion of my Trusty Friends James Linn,
 John I nominate appoint make and receive my sole
 executor of this my last will and Testament in Trust
 for the intent and purpose herein contained and for

In the name of God Amen the 15 of June
 in the year of our Lord 1794 I William Mc Kenna of
 Rowson County and Commonwealth of Kentucky
 being weak in body but of perfect mind and sound
 memory, and knowing also that it is appointed for
 all men once to die, do make and enjoin this and
 no other to be my last will and Testament my
 body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a
 decent and Christian like manner, my soul I re-
 commend to God, through the merits and mediation of
 my Lord and saviour Jesus Christ in hope of a joyful
 resurrection and as concerning such worldly property
 whereunto it hath pleased God to bestow upon me
 I give bequeath and dispose of the same in manner
 and form following — I desire that all my legal
 Debt may be paid by my Executors hereinafter named
 as soon as the circumstances of my estate will admit
 I give and bequeath unto my dear beloved wife
 Elizabeth McKenna the third part of the plantation
 or parcel of land whereon we now live, bearing

193 her natural life, as also her bed and bed furniture with a certain black mare that now has a colt but the colt consigned with her own side saddle and bridle and the income of the mare from the present date as also one negro woman, named Eliza with her increase to her and her heirs forever, as also her books and cupboard, furniture likewise cows sheep and hogs to be at her Disposal.

I give and bequeath, unto my eldest Daughter, Mary one negro child named Sally to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath, unto my son John, the plantation whereon we now live, and one negro mare named Lewis also one negro boy named Henry, to him and his heirs forever, also one black horse, his bed and bed furniture, also the plantation implements and my cloaths.

I give and bequeath to my second Daughter, Jemima £5. to be paid in the following manner (viz) £25. to be paid within twelve months from the present date, and £5. to be paid in the year 1797, and £5. in the year 99, and £5. in the year 1801, with her bed and bed furniture, and her part as laid off, of cupboard furniture, the above sums to be paid by my son John out of the part left him, as also one bay mare which I now have in my possession.

I also will and bequeath, unto my youngest Daughter, Anne £5. to be paid in the following manner (viz) £25. against the first Day of July 1795, and £5. to be paid in the year 96, and ten pounds to be paid in the year 98, and £5. to be paid in the year 1800 out of the same part above mentioned by my son John as also her bed and bed furniture and her part of cupboard furniture, as has been laid off for her beside the colt above mentioned to be his and so hereby nominated and appointed my executors

6 John McElure and Samuel Wilson and my neighbors James Henry, to be the executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and disannul all other and former, wills made by me, at any time heretofore ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and seal the day and year above written.
