I nominate and appoint my sons Thomas Jones, James W Jones, Thomas Mitchell of the Town of Paris, Andrew H Wright and Nicholas Talbot Esquires (before named) Executors and Trustees of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all former wills by me made. These six pages foregoing & do this fourth day of October 1811 sign seal and publish as my last will and Testament in the presence of

I Joseph M^r of the County of Bearbow do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say, that after paying all my just debts - I Give to my loving wife Sarah M^r one negro man named Ralph one riding chair and horse, also a hat to dispose of as she thinks proper. I also give my said wife during her natural life one half the farm where I now live on including the house where I now live with all the furniture as they now stand. - I also give my said wife during her life as appears for negroes Jimmy wife to Ralph & one, Peter and Valantine, negro and team and half of my cattle, sheep and hogs, also one half of the crop on the farm.

2. I give to my son Edmund M^r five hundred acres of land in Bearbow County lying on Kincaid. Including a salt lick called and known by Sellers as Lick. I also give my said son Edmund one negro woman called Abby and his child called Jimmy, one girl called Wenda one boy called George the above mentioned five hundred acres of land and for negroes & their increase I give to my said son Edmund and his heirs forever.

3. Give to my son George M^r five the one half the tract of land in Bearbow where I now live the said tract includes two hundred and thirty acres.
