I Daniel Ayers of Bourbon County and
State of Kentucky now being in my perfect mind
and senses knowing that it is appointed unto all
men, once to die I therefore have upon mature
deliberation have made my last will and testament
and disposed of my earthly possessions in or after
the following order viz.

1. All my lawfull debts are to be paid first

Then it is my will that my beloved wife Matilda
Ayers should hold and be fully invested in the title
of the plantation on which I now live to have her
choise of one hundred Acres thereof and the care
of the balance of said plantation during her natural life

2. It is my will that my Negroes be sold by Executors (my
wife Matilda) viz. Philip David Charles Heph Hitty
and Manah and the money for said Negroes be divided
in the following manner: first the money the amount
of the sale of Heph and Hitty is for the use of my beloved
wife Matilda Ayers, second The money the amount
of the sale of the rest of the above named negroes is to be
equally divided betwixt and the Children of me and my
wife Matilda Ayers to wit, Mary Ann Ayers Hannah
Bice Ayers Matilda Elizabeth Ayers and provided my
wife Matilda should have an other child a lawfull
Heir with the above mentioned Children it is to have
an equal share of my property &c with the other.

Third I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Ma-
tilda Ayers, my Waggons and three Mares, Rods, Sorel
and pleasure also the three best pairs of Cows, five
best Cows, the old Sow and seven best of the other stock
of Hogs ten Cows the Beans and a Tables also the
cross that is on the farm whereon I now live two
Beds and there furniture the Cup boards and its fur-
niture two pots two Ovens and one ten gallon Kettle
the pot rack and hooks two Dishes one basket and
a good plough Clevises and Swingle trees two Hoes
