In the Year of God Amen.
I William Patton of the state of Kentucky and County of Bourbon famous, being in perfect health of Body and of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God. Calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Obtain this my last Will and Testament that is to say: principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God that gave it, and my body I commend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial, at

the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly Estate whom with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, Devise, and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form - First I give and bequeath to my eldest son Joseph One hundred and twenty Acres of land where he now lives including all his improvements, I also give and Bequeath to my son Thomas one hundred Acres including his improvements to which lands I hold by virtue of a bond from James Powers bearing date 7th 30th May one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven. I also give and bequeath to my son John sixty Acres of land to include the improvements where he now lives. I also give and bequeath to my son William fifty Acres of land Joining Ryebotts line and to be clear of my improvements. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one horse and saddle to be worth twenty pounds, two cows and four sheep. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Rosannah, one horse and saddle to be worth twenty pound, two cows and four sheep. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth, one horse and saddle to be worth twenty pounds, two cows and four sheep. I also allow all my deeper furniture to be equally divided among the three (viz) Mary, Rosanna & Elizabeth, also to each of them one bed and bedding of cloaths and spinning wheel. I also allow the profits arising from my remaining lands to be Equally divided amongst the three while single & these profits for only ^{their} that may be single and when all is married then the lands to be sold and the price, to be equally

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I do hereby declare my last and daughters (Viz) Martha,
Rebecca, Sarah, Anna, Mary, Rosannah, and Elizabeth.
I also allow and require my bond by Alexander Patton herein to be
put to whomsoever of my Children my Executors in their wisdom shall
think proper, and that s^d master shall pay to s^d. Alex^r. Patton
herein at the Expiration of his time one cow to the value of
three pounds. I likewise constitute, make and appoint my
son Joseph Patton and my son-in-law Joseph McClinton
my Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby
utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former
Testament, wills and legacies Bequests and Executors by me in any
ways before named willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament.
