

Will of Anthony Johnson

On the name of God Amen

I Anthony Johnson of Boyle County, and State of Kentucky do hereby make this my will and testament in the follow manner and form to wit:
 Item 1st I devise all my just to be paid
 Item 2nd I devise and give to my wife Pircilla Johnson my farm the same on which I now live with all of its appurtenances to hold during her lifetime and at her death to be sold and one half of the proceeds given to my grandchildren the children of my son W^m B Johnson and the other half to be given to my Daughter Martha J Johnson and her heirs

Item 3rd I also give to my wife all my personal estate (after my just debts and funeral expenses have been paid) to hold or dispose of as may seem best to herself

Item 4th I devise to my Daughter Martha J Johnson the sum of eight hundred dollars in cash to balance against a house lot in Parkville Boyle County Kentucky and the sum of two hundred dollars in cash which I give to my grandchildren the children of my son W B Johnson

Item 5th I devise that my son W B Johnson have the use of the property which I leave to his children to live on it and raise and take care of them if he desires to remain there and in case of his death for my daughter in law Sarah C Johnson to still live with the children during her widowhood and in case of her death or end of her widowhood the house lot to be sold and the proceeds to be divided equally between the children of my son if any living and if not living the proceeds as well as the proceeds of the one half of the farm which I give to the children of my son to be given to my daughter Martha J Johnson and her heirs

Item 6th I devise to my son W B Johnson ten dollars in full of his portion of my estate

Item 7th I direct and appoint my wife my executor to carry this my will into execution Given under my hand and seal this 20th day of June 1861 A. Johnson

In the name of God Amen. I John J. Mock of Boyle County, in the State of Kentucky, being of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, considering the uncertainty of this mortal and transitory life, do therefore make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament; that is to say, First, I desire that all my lawful debts, funeral and testamentary expenses be first paid and discharged; then I give devise and bequeath all and singular the rest residue and remainder of my estate both real, personal and mixed unto my beloved wife Ellen A. Mock, to have and to hold the same and every part thereof to her and her heirs and assigns forever, upon the uses and trusts following namely, First, I direct my just debts to be paid and discharged out of the income of my estate, and then to be for the support and maintenance of herself and such of my children as remain with her on the homestead, and contribute by their labor and attention to the management of the estate, until my youngest child shall arrive at lawful age. Then I direct that my estate both, real and personal shall be divided as follows. To my beloved wife Ellen A. Mock, one third of all my estate and the remainder to be equally divided among all my children, share and share alike, and if any of my children shall depart this life before this division takes place, leaving children, such child or children, shall be entitled to and receive the portion that their deceased parent would have been entitled to if living.

I hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Ellen A. Mock executrix and my son Henry Clay Mock executor of this my last Will and Testament.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this eight day of March, Eighteen hundred and sixty two.
