 Horatio I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin &
 Chatham my negro boy Jordan about twelve years of age Also
 my farm on which I now reside at the death of my wife Nancy
 Chatham provided he pays over to each of my heirs nine hun-
 dred the sum of Seventy Seven dollars and 11 cents making all
 together the sum of seven hundred dollars.

Gifts It is my will and desire after the death of my wife that
 the residue of my personal property be sold and the proceeds together
 with all notes then due to my estate be equally divided among
 my legal heirs and the slaves then living (with the exceptions of
 the Boys Henry Jordan be drawn for by my children at
 valuation as before stated and those drawing the most
 valuable shall pay over to the others until each shall be made
 equal (viz) the children of my dec'd daughter Eliza L. Bottom to
 constitute one Slave Share James Chatham Isaac da Hoffmann
 W. H. Chatham Lewis L. Chatham C. J. Chatham children Christy S.
 Chatham A. J. Chatham D. H. Chatham and Agnes S. Kirkland
 to be enjoyed by them and then hereafter with the single
 exception of Agnes S. Kirkland her portion to go to her alone and
 her heirs forever separate and apart from her husband who
 is to execute no contract whatever over any portion of what may
 fall to her from my estate.

Sixth & Lastly I here by constitute and appoint my two sons
 Alfred S. Chatham and Benjamin S. Chatham Executors to
 this my last will & testament. I fully authorize them to carry all
 of its provisions into effect also desire that the County Court do
 not require them to give any security whatever for the performance
 of them duly as my Executors In witness where I have hereto set my
 hand and seal this the 3rd day of November 1860

Sarah Sutton of Boyle County Ky now make & publish this
 as my last will & testimony

I bequeath to Mrs Sarah Ann all of my slaves their increase
 those now living are Minna & her children six in number - Jackson
 - William - Carrie - Ady - Oliver & Sonora also said a decrepit man
 with the strict injunction that said and especially be kindly taken
 care of

Also I bequeath to Mrs Sarah Ann five hundred dollars in
 the stock of the Commercial Bank of Kentucky and five hundred
 dollars in the stock of the Bank of Louisville the certificates of
 which stock I now hold also I bequeath to her all of the house
 hold & kitchen furniture & farming implements & tools which I pur-
 chased from Dr. C. Graham which are now in the house & on the
 premises now occupied & owned by Mrs Ann which was pur-
 chased by her from Dr. C. Graham the above mentioned property hereby
 bequeathed to Mrs Sarah Ann to be her separate estate & be free from
 the control not subject to the debts of her husband and full
 and ample power is hereby conferred on her to dispose of the same
 by will deed or any form of contract whatever as fully as if she was
 unmarried

I have recently given to Mrs Theresa Blackburn, Mrs
 Mary Adams & Mrs Ellen Cook each a sum over two hundred
 dollars I bequeath to them nothing more

Hereby revoking all others wills I make this my last will & testament
 in testimony whereof I have this 12th day of May 1861 sealed
