tion of land & Negroes I will to them during
their life time & then to their heirs, except my knob
land & some land lying on Licking river, which I
want sold & one third of the proceeds to go to my wife
& the balance to be equally divided among my children
I appoint Samuel O. Middleton & Harry Crosby
as my executors

Dread Bolling's Will

I Dread Bolling of Boyle County Kentucky do
make and ordain this my last will and testament here-
by revoking all others by me made. First I wish
all my just debts be paid out of the proceeds of my
property both real and personal. except what is reserv^d.
Second It is my will and desire that my wife Mary-
E. Bolling shall remain in full possession of one hun-
dred acres of the land on which I now reside including
the house and off of the best end of said farm during her nat-
ural life, at her death to be sold and the proceeds equally divid-
ed among a portion of my children (viz) Silas, John, Thomas-
P. M. & George Washington Bolling also two choice horses, two
choice, Ten Hogs all of the House hold & Kitchen Furniture,
all that she may want of the farming utensils, one Coke of
Oxen & ox Wagon all of which to remain in her hands dur-
ing her life, at her death to be divided as above between -
Silas, John, Thomas P. M. & George W. Bolling, in case of
the death of one or more of the above named children, their part
to merge into the general stock and be equally divided among
the balance of the above named children - Third I give
and bequeath unto my two youngest daughters Mary E. Ellen
& Rachel Ann Bolling two negro girls, one named Elizabeth
the other Mathey to be divided with the increase if any, when
the eldest arrives to the age of twenty one or either of them
should Mary in case the two negroes & when divided should
not be valued at one thousand dollars the deficiency to
be made up out of my estate, should Mary E. or Rachel-
A Bolling depart this before said division the survivor
only to be entitled to her portion and the others portion to

be divided among my sons Silas, John Thomas P. M. & George-
W. Bolling - Fourth I give and bequeath to my son Jer-
emiah one gray filley which he calls his also one bed & furniture
and one saddle also one negro boy Jordan - Fifth It is
my desire after the payment of my debts and the specific lega-
cies are settled the residue if any to be applied as follows (viz)
to be equally divided among the following named children -
Elizabeth Greenwood, Nancy P. Curry, Silas, John & Jeremiah Bol-
ling untill they receive an equal amount with what may be
left my younger children (viz) Thomas P. M., George W., Mary E.
& Rachel A. Bolling by their grandfather John Kimberland,
after which, should there still be a balance I wish it equally
divided between all my children. Sixth I hereby constitute
and appoint John A. Darton my Executor to this my
last will and testament fully authorising him to carry all
its provisions into effect. Given under my hand and seal
this the 12th day of December 1845. Also authorize him to
convey by deed the land sold to & of this day and date above
said
