

George Ludlip's Will

I, George Ludlip, of Boyle County, Ky., make & publish this as my last Will and Testament - First I wish my business all all wound up, my debts paid; and to effect this my hereinafter executors are invested with full and ample power to sell the property which I may own at my death -

2nd After my debts are paid I bequeath & will to my two Sisters Mary Jane & Susan Ludlip all of my property & estate of every kind and description whatever, to be equally divided between them -

3rd I appoint my friends John R. Shord & the Rev. Wm. Scott the Executors of this my last will, with full power to either to act in case the other declines - In testimony whereof, I, the said George Ludlip, sign and seal & publish this as my last will & Testament - this 10 Nov 1854 -

William Pipes' Will

I, William Pipes, of the County of Boyle and State of Kentucky, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others by me made

First It is my will and desire, after the payment of my just debts, that my wife, Nancy Pipes shall remain in full possession and control of all the remainder of my estate, both real and personal, during her widowhood - in the event of her marriage, then in that case to be entitled to one third only -

Second At the marriage or death of my wife, it is my will that my Executor, which I will hereafter name, shall advertise and sell all of my property, both real and personal on the usual credit and the proceeds equally divided among my children, with the exception of my daughter Lucinda Moten - such as I have always made advances to account for such advances made in order to make the younger children equal with them - viz - John Pipes, James Pipes, Sarah Brumfield Catharine Survant, William H. Pipes, Mary E. Pipes, Bradford Pipes George H. Pipes Nancy A. Pipes, Martha A. Pipes, Richard B. Pipes, all of the above named children, with the exception above stated to it is my will should share equally on a final settlement of my estate - I hereby constitute and appoint my friend E. S. Caldwell and J. A. Burton, or either of them to carry all its provisions into effect, to make conveyances, &c. Given from under my hand and seal this the 31st day of March 1854
