

I, Jane Gray, of the County of Boyle & State of Kentucky, do hereby make and ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me made.

First, I wish all of my just debts to be paid out of the proceeds of my estate.

Second After my death I wish all of property, both real and personal sold to the highest bidder upon the usual terms, with the exception of my black woman Rachel - my black man Joe having been emancipated by the will of my brother Robert Gray, to take effect at my death, which I hereby ratify and confirm.

Third It is my desire that my Executor take charge of my black woman Rachel, after my death, and hire her out at any price he may think proper, giving her husband Joe the preference during the life of said Rachel.

Fourth It is my will that my Executor apply as much of the proceeds of my Estate as may be required, first to the purchase of four tombstones of marble, one for my father & mother one for my brother Robert, and one for myself, after they are completed. It is my wish that my Executor have the graves of all my brothers and sisters which may be buried at the family burying ground, including my nephew John Gray, enclosed with partly a stone wall with iron railing on the top of said wall.

Fifth The residue of my estate, should there be any I wish placed either in Banks or into the hands of some safe individual at interest, and the interest applied annually to the schooling of four children whose parents are not able to school them.

Sixth and lastly I constitute and appoint my friend John A. Banton my Executor to this my last Will and Testament fully authorizing him to carry all of its provisions into effect.

I J. G. Zimmerman, Clerk of the Boyle County Court, do certify that the foregoing instrument of writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Jane Gray, dec^d was produced to said Court at its February Term 1861, by the Executor named therein, and offered for probate, and the probate thereof being resisted, the same was continued until the above (March) Term

of said Court, at which time the due execution and declaration of the same by said Jane Gray, dec^d as her last Will and Testament was duly proved by the oaths of A. J. Walker and J. Gook Knight the subscribing witnesses thereto, who testified that the same was signed and declared in their presence by said Testatrix and witnessed by them in her presence and in the presence of each other, and at her instance and request - and that they regarded said Testatrix at the time as sound and disposing in her mind and memory as they had ever seen her. Whereupon it was adjudged by the Court that said instrument of writing is the true last will and Testament of said Jane Gray, dec^d and as such it was ordered to be recorded - which has been truly done in my office.

The Last Will and Testament of Rachel B. Craig
I, Rachel B. Craig make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

1st I will, as soon after my death as my Executors may deem proper, all my property of every kind be sold and converted into money, and out of the proceeds, my ^{general expenses} debts be paid.

2^d I emancipate and forever set free my slaves John about 31 or 32 years old; Sabitha about 29 or 30 years old; Sally about 15 years old and Laura about 13 years old; together with any increase they may hereafter have, and to enable them to be removed from Kentucky, I devise and bequeath to each the sum of One Hundred Dollars which my Executors will use for that purpose, and in making such necessary purchase, as they may deem right and proper, and any surplus of the One Hundred Dollars to each of the said Slaves will be paid to them. If either Sally or Laura should be under twenty-one years of age at my death, I desire, if it be permitted by the laws of Kentucky, that my Executors, if they deem it best, hire out said Slaves, Sally and Laura into good and respectable families, and the hire, after defraying their expenses, be paid them severally, after they arrive at the age of twenty-one years. To John, Sabitha, Sally and Laura, in addition to the One Hundred Dollars above named, I bequeath to each Five
