4th I will bequeath all my estate Real & Personal that may be remaining after the payment of all my just debts & the expenses of administration, without condition or hindrance in fee simple forever to my beloved wife Julia J. Heron, and desire that she take the same into her possession as soon as possible & sell, dispose of or convey or keep the same as she may deem proper. My library Miscellaneous slave Spanish to be kept for my children, but this is not a binding wish - i.e. the keeping of the library - Provided that should it come into possession of any Estate Real or Personal by descent or devise from my own family subsequent to this date I will bequeath that one third of the same go to my beloved wife aforesaid and the rest to my children share & share alike and should they (the children) both die without issue then I bequeath as fully & amply as I may possess it, one half of such devised or descended property to my wife Julia J. Heron and the other half to my sister Helen Heron. Provided that this shall not affect the lawful descent of property which may now be willed to me or which may be willed to me & which would go to my children should I die before such will shall take effect.

5th I hereby constitute & appoint my Brother James Heron as Executor of this my last will & relying on his integrity hereby give him full discretion to act as he may see proper. Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 24th day of July 1857.
