Zimmerman, Clerk of the Boyle County Court, do certify that the foregoing Instrument of Writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Isabella Reed, dec'd, was at its above term produced in Court, and the due and legal execution and declaration thereof by said Isabella Reed, duly proven by the oaths of Charles Henderson and Catherine S. Lucas the Subscribing witnesses thereto; Whereupon said Instrument of Writing was adjudged by the Court to be the true last will and Testament of said Isabella Reed, and as such it was ordered to be recorded, which has been truly done in my office.

I Margaret Morrow of the town of Danville and Commonwealth of Kentucky, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and ordain, this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others. I direct my just debts, if there are any and my funeral expenses to be first paid before any division or distribution of my property. I desire to be buried by the side of my deceased husband, in the Danville Cemetery. I give and bequeath to my son William S. Morrow and my daughter Ann Eliza Morrow, jointly, the house and lot now occupied by me, with the appurtenances, for the term of three years, next after my death, unless they shall jointly direct that said property shall be sold, and the proceeds divided, as herein after directed, at any time before the expiration of said time. At the expiration of said time or sooner if directed as aforesaid my executor shall the said property and divide the proceeds thereof in the following manner to wit: We shall first of all pay the sum of two thousand dollars, to my said daughter Ann Eliza. The remainder of said proceeds he shall divide into four equal parts. One of which parts I give to my son William S. aforesaid. One of which I give to my son Thomas S. and one of them I give to my grand daughter Margaret Mary the child of my daughter Mary Jane Harget. But my executor shall retain the legacy in his hands & manage it for the benefit of my said Grand daughter until she arrives at the age of eighteen years: the remaining part I give to my son Wilson S. Morrow in the event of his being alive and claiming it within one year after the sale of the property. Otherwise I give this portion equally to my said daughter Ann Eliza and my said sons William S. and Thomas S. To my said daughter Ann Eliza I give and bequeath all the household appurtenances of every kind and description of which I shall be possessed, including every sort & kind of moveable and perishable property, in and about my said residence, and upon the said lot or which usually appertain to, or was kept or used there on. To my son Alexander S. Morrow I give and bequeath the Bible and hymn book being mournfully

convinced that although he has received more than his share nothing that I could leave him in the way property would do him any good, and being well convinced his sister and brothers will take care of him as far as the can. The rest and residue of my property of which I may die possessed or to which I may be entitled at my death I give will & bequeath equally to my daughter Ann Eliza and my son William & and Thomas & I hereby appoint my son William & know my executor without security of this my last will and testament hereby authorizing him to sell and convey the real estate herein devised in the manner herein provided.

First I hereby constitute and appoint William Boling of the County and State aforesaid my Executor of this my last will and testament, directing said executor to pay all my just debts and funeral expenses out of my effects the remainder to be divided as herein after directed with my children. Second. After the payment of my debts and funeral expenses, I give to Elizabeth Bowers & Elitha Bates the sum of one dollar each. The remainder of my effects I give to Mary Duncan and her heirs forever all of which is to be paid over to each of them as soon as may be convenient after the expiration of twelve months from the date of my decease. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal and Publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, in the presence of the witnesses named below this the third day of May eighteen hundred and sixty two A.D.
