

and that she cease to be a distributess until the rest of my children receive portions equal to hers in Negroes and money in the manner following

2nd My wish is that my Son William Hawkins have one negro man named David at the price of three hundred dollars and that my Son Cary Hawkins have one negro man named Peter at the price of six hundred dollars and that my Son Charles Hawkins have two Negro boys Towil Howard at five hundred dollars and Anderson at two hundred and fifty dollars and if he Charles should die without heirs my wish is that said negroes revert back to my estate and be equally divided between my other children My further wish is that my Grand daughters before named Amanda and Sally Ann Kerby have a negro woman named milly at the price of four hundred dollars and that she milly be placed in the hands of William Hawkins and hired for the benefit of said Amanda & Sally Ann until their marriage and should they die without heirs my desire is that said negro milly revert back to my estate with her increase & be equally divided with my other children My further wish is that Catharine Summers have a negro man named Charles at the price of six hundred dollars my further wish is that my daughter Ann Gentry have a negro woman named Caroline at the price of five hundred dollars my further desire is that my daughter Martha McDowell have a negro girl named Jane at the price of Four hundred & fifty dollars

My further wish is that my Grand daughter Ann Grimes have a negro boy named Harrison at the price of Three hundred & fifty dollars it being a part of the legacy of her mother Betsy Grimes and to be deducted from her portion of my estate and should said Ann die without heirs my wish is that said boy Harrison revert back to the estate of Betsy Grimes and should she Betsy Grimes die without heirs my desire is that her portion of my estate revert back & be equally divided between my other children

And 3rd My further wish and desire is that each of my children herein before named after having received in Negroes & money portions equal to that of my daughter Sophia Gordon viz fourteen hundred & fifty dollars shall each receive an equal portion of the ballance of my estate my Grand daughters Amanda & Sally Ann Kerby receiving their mothers portion to be equally divided between them And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint

my Son William Hawkins Executor of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 7th day of December 1844

Item 4th my desire is that Mariah R. Davis wife of James Davis have three hundred & fifty dollars out of the sale of my house & lot in the Town of Camodaburg

Item 5th the Negroes paterly Joe Lucy Susan Henry & Alamo I recognize as having paped to my deceased son D. M. Humble & to be divided between his widow and her two

Children David F Kumble & Thomas S Kumble according to law

Sixthly I hereby constitute & appoint John W Cardwell my Attorney in fact to sell my house & lot in the Town of Harrodsburg publicly or privately on the following terms one half the purchase money in 12 months the Balance of purchase money in two years from date of sale the payments to be handed to R P Gregory as they fall due & collected by my Attorney in fact John W Cardwell & upon full payment of the purchase money the said John W Cardwell - Attorney in fact to convey title by deed of General Warranty

Item 7th my desire is that David F Kumble & Thomas S Kumble my two grand children have the remainder of money arising from sale of my house & lot in the Town of Harrodsburg (except the foregoing devised)

Item 8th my desire is that R P Gregory act as Trustee for my two Grand children David F & Thomas S Kumble & use what he thinks proper for their education & give the remainder if any to them equally as they respectively arrive at 21 years of age

Lastly I appoint R P Gregory my Executor of this my last will & Testament this the 28th day of January 1853 Witness my hand & Seal

Will of Silas Erwin.

I, John Erwin of Boyle County Kentucky do make and declare this instrument of writing my to be my last Will and Testament.

1. I wish all my just debts to be paid out of my estate by my executor herein after named, as soon after my decease as may be practicable.

2. The rest and remainder of my estate, after the payment of my debts, as directed, real and personal and mixed. I give and devise to my wife Martha Erwin to be held and enjoyed by her during her natural life.

3. Upon the death of my said wife Martha Erwin she may by Will properly executed, dispose of one half of the estate herein mentioned as she may think proper; and for that purpose she is now, upon the taking effect of this Will invested with the proper title thereto.

4. Upon the death of my said wife Martha Erwin I give and bequeath to my son George T. Erwin in fee simple the one half of my estate then remaining together with the remainder undisposed of by my said wife Martha Erwin - if any there be.

5. If it may be necessary to dispose of any part of my estate to pay my debts, such a part or parts thereof may be sold by my said Executor for that purpose, either publicly or privately as my Executor may think best, which my said Executor & my wife Martha Erwin should judge could most conveniently be spared - and my said Executor is authorized to make to the purchaser the necessary and proper conveyance.

6 I direct my said Executor to pay to my niece Martha C. McKee One hundred dollars -

7 My slave Billy having served me faithfully I desire that he be permitted to occupy the house now used by him in Danville, belonging to me, as long as he shall live -

8 I appoint James S. Hopkins, Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and request him to see the same faithfully executed.
