I Thomas Coulter of Boyle County do hereby make
 this my last will and testament in manner and
 form following that is to say I give to my son
 Escham the farm on which I now reside I desire also
 that Escham shall have and maintain my two
 Negro Women Clara & Cinth as I consider them of no
 value I also desire that my man Pack is to stay
 with Escham to help support the two women as long
 as they live and after their death (that is the two
 women) Escham is to have Pack at the appraisment
 less one hundred dollars

I desire further that my other children that are living
 and the heirs of those that are dead be made equal
 out of the balance of my negroes and that is done the
 remaining negroes be divided equally among them This
 last clause is intended to include all my children except
 Escham

I desire and intend that what I give my daughters
 shall go to them and their bodily heirs
 I will now state what I have given each of my chil-
 dren which they are to be charged with in the
 settlement of my estate My Daughter Susan Murphy
 I charge her with thirteen hundred dollars My son
 John & his heirs including what he secured in his life
 time I charge him with nine hundred Dollars

My Daughter Oliver four hundred & fifty Dollars
 My Daughter Fanny eleven hundred & fifty Dollars
 My Daughter Betty three hundred Dollars My
 Daughter Polly twelve hundred Dollars I wish
 and desire that my Escham shall have one third of
 cattle one third of third hogs & sheep and also the
 horses that are the produce of his mare Buck The two
 horse wagon & gear one half of the farming tools also
 one third of crop on hand at the time of my death The
 house and kitchen furniture belonging to me I desire to
 to be sold my Turnpike stock and my share in the ag-
 ricultural association in Danville I give to my son
 Escham one half of the Buggy & one half of my wheat
 Pan I give to him also my old bench tools I wish
 him to have also all of my estate of wheat ever kind
 is not disposed of I wish sold by my executor &
 divided equally between my son John & his heirs and my
 daughters I having specified what Escham is to have
 above

It is my desire that my Negroes should be

divided, if it can be agreeably done and that they be accommodated as much as possible to suit husband or wife, as the case may be. And lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my son Escham and my friend W L Baldwin my executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and offered my seal this 18th 1862

I Chs Coulter do hereby make and publish this codicil to be added to my last will and testament in manner as follows. I have some cash on hand I suppose about fifty dollars also some cash notes one on Josh Owens and Sam Owens probably drawn in Eschams name for about three hundred dollars one on Wm Walker for about thirty which I wish to go into my executor's hands to be disposed of as my other property that is to be divided with my other heirs excepting Escham. I will here state that I was born on the 1st day of April 1783 within one mile of the head of Salt river. And lastly it is my desire that this present codicil be annexed to and made apart of my last will and testament aforesaid in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and offered my seal this 18th 1862

The Will of William Stewart of Boyle County Kentucky

I William Stewart of Boyle County do make Publish & proclaim this to be my last will & Testament
1st I wish all of my debts & funeral expenses to be paid among which debts I estimate the sum of twenty hundred Dollars due to my son Robert for his long & faithful service of twenty two years on my farm. The debt to said Robert I will shall be paid as follows fifteen hundred dollars in cash & the balance to be paid to him in a Negro man named Horton.
2nd I devise to my son Robt the farm on which I reside containing about two hundred & twenty two acres. But he must pay to my executor or who ever may administer on my estate a fair Price for the same on credit of one two and three years equal payments with interest which price is to be fixed by valuation of two disinterested citizens of Boyle County to be chosen by my executors or who ever may administer on my estate. If from any cause my son Robt should not take the land at said valuation then the same is to be sold on like credit & interests & my executor or who ever may administer on my estate are here invested with full power & authority to sell and convey the same to the purchaser & may convey at any time after & add reserving a lien for the purchase money paid at the time of the conveyance.
