do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that
isto say Principally and first of all I Give & recommend
my Soul into the hands of God that first Give it and for
my body I recommend it unto the Earth to be buried in a Christ-
ian like manner at the Discretion of my friends and as touch-
ing such Worldly things as it has pleased God to bestow on me
in this life I Give in the following manner and form
To wit it is my desire that all my just debts be paid and
Satisfied. Item

I Give and Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Rachael
Black the fields on both sides of the lane leading from the House
to the top of the hill to include the house and Spring together
together with a sufficient Quantity of Timber for the sup-
port of the farm and firewood to be taken out of any part of
the Tract also one half the Stock of hogs the big bay mare two
bays three yearlings one bed and furniture the kitchen furniture
and barn with its furniture her trunk two sets of beer for
ploughing and one plough all to be for her use and under her
Direction During her life time and at her Death the land
to be Equally Divided between my two sons James Black and
Robert Black together with rest of the tract of Land which
I now live on and the balance of the property she leaves
to be Equally divided between James Black Robert Black &
my Daughters Ann Black ^{Ann Black} and Margaret Black. Item
I Give and bequeath to my son James Black the field
on the top of the hill and privilege to clear as much
adjoining as he sees cause Item

27 I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Black the Darks
mare and a cow and one feather bed and furniture. Item

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Jean Black the pinx mare
the late mares colt one heifer and one feather bed with its furniture
Item

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Black the
young Blaze Horse one cow one yearling and calf and one feather
Bed with its furniture Item

I Give my Waggon to my sons James and Robert to enable them
to purchase a mantle and saddle for their sister Margaret and
if they do not furnish her with said saddle and mantle of a good
Quality the Waggon to be sold by my Executor for that purpose Item
I Give my Farming and Carpenter tools to be Equally Divided
between my two sons James Black and Robert Black except one
plough and two sets of beer before excepted. Item

I Give and bequeath to my son Joseph Black the sum of six shilling
current money Item

I Give and bequeath to my son John Black the sum of six
shilling current money Item

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Miller the sum
of six shilling current money Item

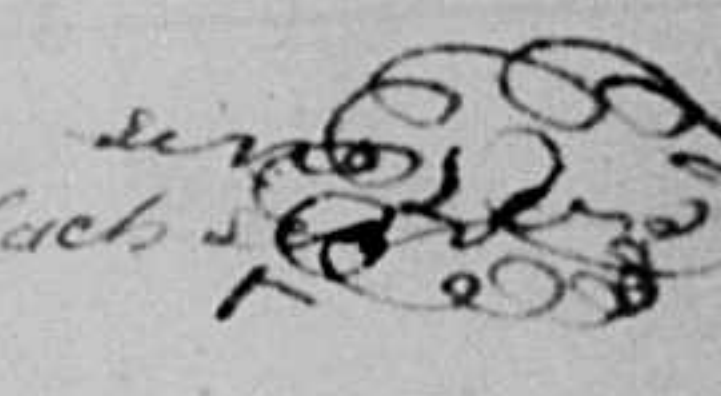
I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ellen the sum of

and Robert after my Wife having one half and my Daughters having
the part they severally heretofore have laid claim to I do hereby

young Executors to this my last Will and Testament
