mentioned— Secondly I give and bequeath to my
well beloved wife a Bonded mair now in my possession
and likewise to my well beloved Wife Catty that cow
and calf that is at Jacob Gibsons and likewise a bott
that borne of my Grey mare and I likewise give to my
beloved Wife that cow that is at James Whites her brother.
Thirdly I do give and bequeath my beloved Daughter Polly
Hardwitch one black mair and one year old bott and one
cow now at her uncles James Whites. Lastly I constitute
and Appoint my beloved Wife Catty Executor and Leonard
Taylor Robert Denton Executors of this my last Will and
Testament In Testimony I have hereof subscribed and
my hand and seal this twenty third day of March one

Independence of the United States of America.

I Isaac Lowe of Barren County and State of Kentucky
do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the
form following To wit, first it is my will that the whole of my
estate after my Debts are paid, shall remain in the hands of
my wife Sally Lowe for the use and benefit of her and my Children
so long as she shall remain a Widow under the direction of my
Executors hereafter named, secondly it is my Will that if my Wife
shall hereafter marry and my Executors shall think it will be to
the advantage of my Children for my Estate to remain in the
hands of my Wife after marriage and the proceeds thereof be
applied to the Education and benefit of my Children they
shall remain so until the youngest child shall
shall come to lawful age. But if any of my said Children
shall marry it is my Will that my Executors shall give them as
much of my personal Estate as in their opinion can be spared
from the support of the remaining part of the family to be
accounted for by them when a division of the whole of my
Estate shall take place. It is my Will that when my young-
est Child shall come to age that my Estate shall be equally
divided amongst my said Children reserving to my Wife
her third part her life time which third part shall be at
her Death divided equally amongst my legal Heirs It is
my Will that my Executors raise money out of my personal
Estate to pay the State price of the tract of land I
