 will and Testament in form and manner following viz
 Item 1st I Give my Spirit into the hands of God from
 whence it came and my Body resign to the Dust to be interred
 according to the Desire of my Executors & Executors hereafter
 appointed where I wish it to lie until the morning of the
 Resurrection at which time my Soul and Body shall be again
 reunited and join with Angels (I hope) to sing the praises
 of my Redeemer through all Eternity. As to my worldly
 Goods I devise and Bequeath them as follows viz

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Item 2nd It is my wish and Desire that all Debts due me shall
 be collected as soon as possible or the Nature of my Contracts will
 admit of and the money applied to the payment of my Debts & also the
 money arising from the sale of two Steers and as many Hogs as can
 be conveniently spared from the use of the Family the ensuing fall
 to be applied in the same way (that is) the paying of my just Debts
 Item 3rd I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Hardy
 all moneys remaining after my Debts are paid to her use and Disposal
 forever Item 4th I lend to my beloved wife Mary During her
 natural life four feather Beds & Furniture & all my House hold and
 Kitchen furniture Plantation utensils &c
 Item 5th I also Lend to my beloved wife during her natural
 life one Bay Mare called Lady one bay gelding called Bluford and one
 Saddle Colt that came out of a sorrel Mare that I have given to my Daugh-
 ter Nancy Birks Item 6th I also lend to my beloved wife for
 her use and support during her Natural life three thousand dollars
 with their Increase also my stock of Hogs (except the reserve above
 mentioned) to be for her use and Disposal for life
 Item 7th All the property that I have lent to my beloved wife
 as above mentioned that remains at her Decease I Give and bequeath
 unto two of my sons viz George Hardy & Judathian Hardy to be
 Equally Divided between them as they may think proper
 Item 8th Whereas I have heretofore given unto my other
 Children viz Rhoda Drumpf Thomas Hardy Asham Hardy
 Moses Hardy & Nancy Birks their full portions I think it need-
 less to say any thing more concerning them Item 9th
 I constitute and Appoint my Wife Mary Hardy Executor and
 George Hardy Executor of this my last Will and Testament and
 do by these present revoke and Disannul all other Wills & Testaments
 by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my only one Given from

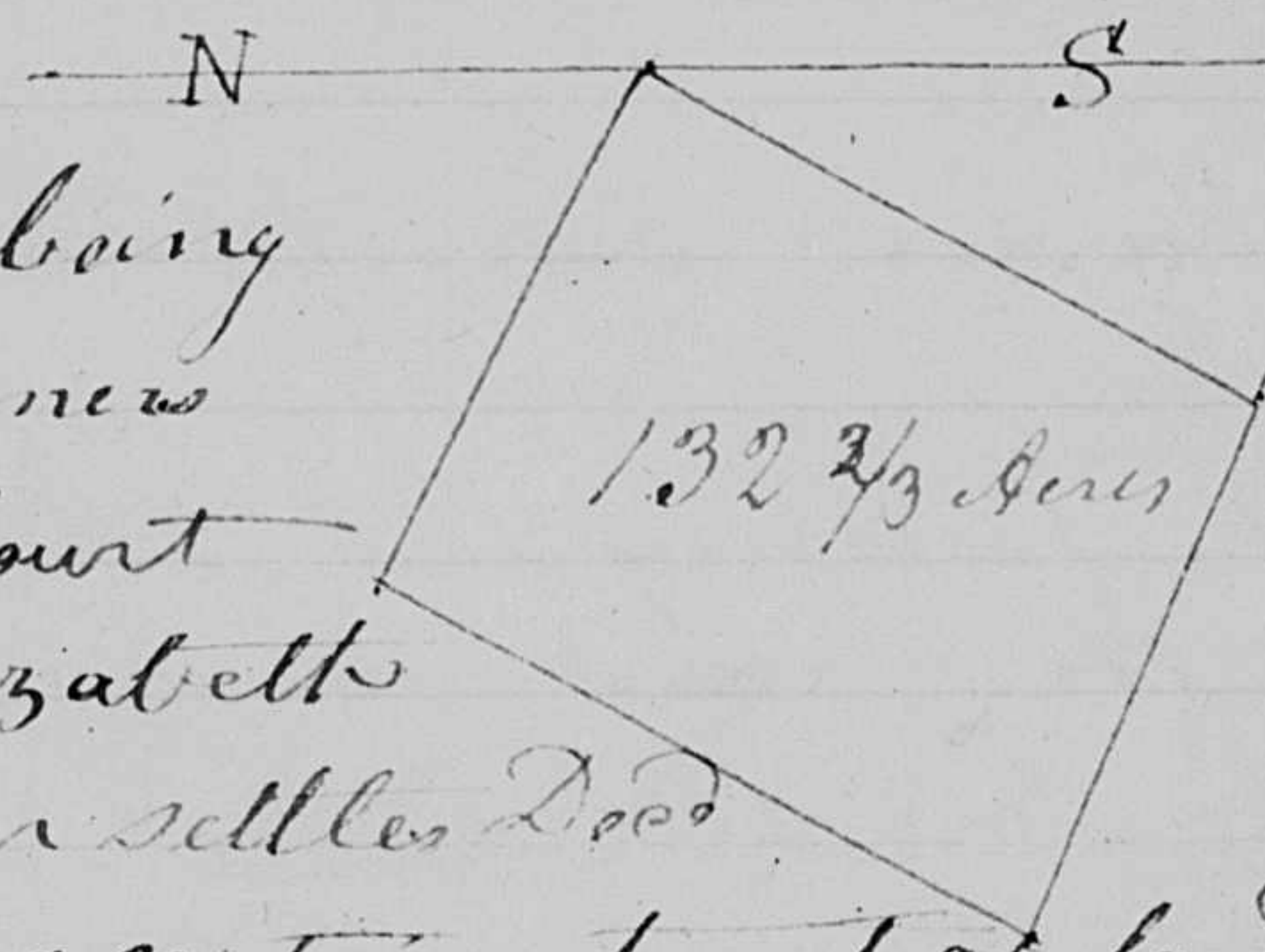
