Causey of Buckinridge County and State of Kentucky do make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to Say: I desire that all my personal Estate be sold after my deceased amount of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid shall be my personal estate proceeds sufficient for the above purposes I desire several of my land to be sold as will be sufficient to pay such of my just debts as shall remain unpaid out of the sale of my personal estate.

1st After paying my just debts and funeral expenses I give to my daughter Nancy McLean two hundred dollars amount of bank bonds which is now in the hands of Alexander McLean Esq. I also give to my daughter Nancy McLean a Negro Woman Adeline during her natural life and then to descend to my other children.

2nd I give all the balance of my Estate both real and personal equally between my three children (to wit) John McLean, Nancy McLean and Alexander McLean Esq. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons John McLean and Alexander McLean Esq. Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made in Writing when I have been in full of my mind and affixed my Seal this the sixteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three

the remainder of my debts I^d after my debts be paid - it is my Will & desire
that my wife hold the balance of my estate for the use & benefit of her self & children
& after death, then the property is given to my present children. I hereby consti-
tute my friend James Henry my Executor to carry this my last Will & Testament
into effect. Given under my hand the 25th day of November 1843.
