The last 36 Notes are made by men in Miss^{rs} Linn and all bear interest except those by Evans and Howell and the 50^{off} note by Supp^r Taylor and the interest on all the rest except those by Sam Williams & Horn is due every year payable annually the first note noted by Hustindell was given for \$28500 but was credited 150^{off} the same day all of these notes were given for land except Williams. I have left in the hands of James Linn Esq Lundry Notes given for in value about \$15000 and in the hands of Lewis Linger of Lainsville are note on Robt Fisher for \$1500 and one on J. H. Rice for \$500 to secure him against a Mortgage My other Notes and papers are with James M. Graves and John W. Taylor Oct 5th 1849

Marrying again the property he disposed of just as
the laws of our Country provides for in case of no Will

My Dear Nancy I was never so much disappointed.
The Ohio ~~Boat~~ so low that the Boat I expected
to meet the day I left home was 14 days getting from
Louisville to this place but two Boats are now up and
I expect to leave before day or tomorrow morning. I
deemed it best to stay as we were constantly looking
for boats and now that they have come I had better
make my trip. if I make but a short one, I will
write you as soon as I get to Louisville where I
hope to hear from you on my arrival. I feel
unutterable anxiety about you and our dear
little ones but I must go.

My health has been tolerable good. I have found
the people about here extremely kind. I preached
for them and have visited the Sulphur Springs and
prepared myself a horse to be at the River on my
return, so that I may have no delay. I send you
this schedule of my papers and wishes, not knowing
what may occur except that they can do no harm.
Your Uncle J. W. Tyler has Charles Fages notes for me
for between \$800 & \$900 and Bro Graves has notes for
me and J. Miller & others for near \$10000 so you see
we have more than ten thousand dollars in notes
out of which I think we can pay all our debts. I have
many papers of value not now here. it is such a task
to describe them. but they could nearly all be ascertained
by inquiries of Ben Clarke J. W. Tyler, J. M. Graves and
by the papers left at home. I hope and pray that
we may be spared to see our business in better
condition more concentrated and better guarded, and
I feel confident of success. Let Tish work for Bro
Holden to pay him for helping us to some potatoes
he will come when he thinks it is time to dig.

Do not fail to kill one of the fat Shoats and have
plenty to eat. Let Tish split rails near as he can get
good timbers to the lower branch fence to make that
up. please give my love to all the neighbors and
tell Sister Northrop that I will bring something for
the little preacher if I do not forget it.

Write to me often and be assured that I will do
all I can for our mutual interest.

Be it remembered that this cause came on for hearing before the Court upon petition, Evidence and proof from which it appears to the Court that said Allen Kendrick on the 5th day of October 1859 made and published his last will and Testament all of which with the signature thereto was in his own hand writing that said decedent died in the County of Hardin and state of Tennessee in the month of December 1859 that said paper writing was after his death found among his valuable papers and which was at the February Term 1860 of the County Court of the County of Hardin state of Tennessee propounded for probate, and by Cary A. Armstrong James J. Healy and Jacob Luther three credible witnesses proved

to be in the hand writing of said Allen Hendrick
 And that the same was by the order and decree of
 said County Court made at said Term of said
 Court duly and legally established and admitted
 of record as the true and last Will and Testament
 of said Testator, And that the Transcript filed
 as an Exhibit to said petition is a true
 Copy of said last Will and Testament together
 with the proceedings had thereon in said
 Court all of which is duly authenticated according
 the Act of Congress and in pursuance to the laws
 of this State in such cases made and probated;

It is therefore ordered and decreed by the

 news paper published in the County for 5 weeks
 and no longer - There being no personal property
 in this State belonging to said Estate the appointment
 of appraisers is unnecessary - It is further ordered
 that the proceedings herein be recorded

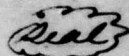
