I Andrew Barger of the County of Breckinridge and State of Kentucky a farmer being of sound mind and disposing mind and memory do make publish and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and as to my worldly estate all, all the property, real personal and mixed of which I shall die possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease, I devise bequeath and dispose thereof in the following manner: I desire that all my just debts and funeral expenses shall be paid. To my son Thomas J. Barger I bequeath one dollar, and this with a certain tract of land which I have heretofore deeded to him, I believe and consider to be his proportionate part of my estate. To my son P. S. Barger I will and bequeath one dollar, and this with a certain tract of land which I have heretofore deeded to him, I believe and consider to be his proportionate part of my estate. To my son George W. Barger I will and bequeath one dollar, and this with cash which I have paid and caused to be paid to him I believe and consider to be his proportionate part of my estate. To my son J. S. W. Barger I will and bequeath one dollar and this with a certain lot of land which I have deeded to him I consider equal in value to each of the other children. To my wife Mary A. Barger I have deeded a certain tract of land which at her death is specified in deed as reverting to my son J. S. W. Barger and which I desire shall fall to him. My son J. S. W. Barger shall care for my wife during her life. Any other property notes or moneys of which I may die possessed I bequeath in full to my wife and she can dispose of same at her will and convenience and all remaining property at her death which may remain undisposed of shall be equally divided between the four children heretofore mentioned. I hereby appoint my wife Mary A. Barger my Executrix and she shall not be required to give bond or furnish an inventory to any court of record.
